BISHOP WORRELL ON CHURCH UNITY His Lordship Wants the Words "High" and "Low" Church Wiped Out

HALIFAX, June 23.—The thirteenth session of the Diocesan Synod of Nova Scotia was opened by service at St. Paul's at 11 yesterday morning. His Lordship the Bishop of Nova Scotia was the celebrant, assisted by Rev. Archdeacon Kaibach, of Truro, and Rev. Archdeacon Smith, of Cape Breton, while the sermon was preached by Rev. G. B. Martell, M. A. of Matland. The service was largely attended.

The business session opened at St. Paul's Parish Hall, at three o'clock, when the Bishop delivered his charge which was very lengthy, dealing in a comprehensive manner with the work of the Diocese, and making many valuable suggestions.

"It would be a great thing," he said, "if a United Christendom were able to face it. But, if not that, why should there not be at least a United Church." The Bishop continued: "There is an unfortunate tendency on the part of those who do not know the Church's history and who have never seen her full work freely carried out, to think that she is not adapted for the present age, and in consequence they withdraw themselves to some extent from the doctrines and usages which have been entrusted to us, and honestly think that by so doing, they may advance the cause of unity."

"Now unity is to be devoutly prayed for and advanced by all legitimate means, but the unauthorized acts of individuals not only delay a lawful and well consummated union, but lower the entire Church. Whatever concessions we may make when the opportunity comes—and I am prepared to go a long way in concessions—we are only weakening the cause by throwing up one position before hand and causing those who might be disposed to yield to constituted authority to stiffen themselves against any advance."

"As a matter of fact, so far as the Church is concerned, the first step toward Christian Union is to become a unit ourselves, and that can only be by Loyalty to the old standards and a universal adoption of the Church's distinctive teaching and practice. If it be thought feasible to secure unity with our separated brethren, it ought surely to be an easier thing to obtain union within our borders. I should welcome any movement that might be made with a view of wiping out, once and forever, those wretched words, High and Low Church and all they are supposed to stand for."
