REDUCTION OF NATIONAL DEBT

Budget To-day Will Show Thirteen Millions Surplus

Sir Oliver Mowat's Serious State—His Recent Accident and Age—Children Poisoned Eating Canned Goods.

POISONED BY CANNED STUFF.

MONROE, April 15. (Special).—While playing near Memramcook three young sons of Oliver Breaux found a partly used can of canned goods, ate the contents and were subsequently taken ill and one died. The other two are in a serious condition. It is thought the can was thrown from an express train dining car.

BUDGET BROUGHT DOWN TODAY.

OTTAWA, April 15. (Special).—When Finance Minister Fielding delivers his financial statement tomorrow, he will announce the largest surplus Canada has had since confederation.

The probable surplus on account of Consolidated Fund will be about \$13,000,000 and the real surplus about \$5,000,000.

It is believed Fielding's budget will wipe out all the present Government has added to the debt.
