### Post-Graduate Vocal Recital

MISS MARGARET STERNS, OF CHARLOTTETOWN, WAS HEARD WITH PLEASURE AND APPRECIATION BY LARGE AUDIENCE

A post-graduate recital of outstanding merit was given before a large audience in Bethoven Hall, Sackville, on Monday evening by Miss Margaret Sterns of Charlottetown, soprano vocalist. The remembrance of an exceptionally good graduating recital by Miss Sterns last year had led us to look forward with pleasurable anticipation to this event and the opinion freely expressed at the close of the concert was that a further year's tuition under Miss Hessell had resulted in a marked advance in Miss Sterns's art.

Throughout an exacting programme, every item of which was well suited to her clear soprano voice—a voice of singularly attractive quality—Miss Sterns maintained a high standard of performance. Too often are vocalists prone to regard each and every song they sing as nothing more than a vehicle for the display of their vocal powers; not so Miss Sterns who gave evidence of having carefully studied her songs and, understanding them herself, was animated by an earnest desire to bring her audience into sympathy with her reading of the words and music. Musicianship in vocalists is not so common that one can take it for granted and therefore there is every credit due to a young singer who sets her feet on the right way.

To come to the programme, Miss Sterns commenced with a recit and air from Mozart's "Figaro" and her first group also included songs by Brahms. Two Child Songs by Fraser-Simson were sung in delightful fashion and were greatly enjoyed by the audience. Later, a scene from the opera "Hansel and Gretel" in which Miss Sterns was assisted by Miss Gwendolyn Archibald was very well done, the two vocalists delighting the audience with their artistic presentation of the name parts. A group of modern songs concluded Miss Sterns's programme. Miss Ruth Linton discharged her difficult task as accompanist in a thoroughly satisfactory manner. A pianoforte arrangement of an orchestral score is no easy thing to tackle and Miss Linton merits high praise for her capable rendering of the difficult accompaniment in "Hansel and Gretel" and she was equally up to her task in the last item, an air from an opera by Wakefield Cadman. A group of students of the violin department of the Conservatory assisted at the recital and rendered several items acceptably.

### Church Services

REV. A. J. VINCENT AT THE BAPTIST CHURCH

Rev. A. J. Vincent spoke Sunday morning and evening to large audiences at the Baptist Church, delivering most impressive and appealing messages on each occasion. Mr. Vincent's morning subject was "The Song of the Redeemed" based on Rev. 1, 5: "Unto Him that hath loved us, and loosed us from our sins by His blood; and He made us to be a Kingdom, to be priests unto His God and Father; to Him be the glory and the dominion for ever and ever." Nearly two thousand years ago the angels of God sang the prelude to that mighty song when they greeted the birth of the incarnate God in Christ with "Glory to God in the highest." The angels could sing the song of welcome but not even the highest seraphim could sing this new song—the song of men and women who have been redeemed by the blood of Jesus.

David speaks of this song when he speaks of his rescue from the horrible pit and the miry clay, but until Jesus came the new song was not set to music. This is the national anthem of the Kingdom of God. We must learn this anthem on earth or we shall not be able to sing it in Heaven.

There are three words to be remembered from this new song, "love, sin and the blood."

He loved me. "All that you and I need to know is that God loves us—if we believe it. When Jesus came He brought only love with Him, God loves you in your sin and out of your sin."

He washed me from my sins. That speaks to us of Him who came to sacrifice His life and blood for you and me. In this modern age men filled with pseudo learning belittle the blood of Jesus. This bloodless theology has led the world to the very verge of the bottomless pit—it is putting the Church out of commission and is keeping the world away from God. There is no salvation save through blood. No man should dare make light of sin and the blood. The sinner is by nature and choice God's foe. If we spurn and reject the blood of Jesus we are eternally lost—shut out from God forever.

He made me. That statement lifts us up through the blood into kingdom. If we have accepted Christ, God has clothed us with the spotless robe of His righteousness—He has made us safe—He has brought us into glory. Blessed is the blood which has closed the way to Hell for the redeemed and has opened the pathway to God. There are many things that we do not wish to have forever, but there are some few things that we wish to see preserved to all eternity, and above them all is the thought of Jesus to have dominion forever, the sceptre and crown are to Him, world without end.

Mr. Vincent's evening subject was "The Meaning of God's Love Gift." His text again was John 3, 16. Every movement for the salvation of men begins in the great heart of God—Christ is God's sacrifice for the lost—the Bible is God's love letter to man.
