- KILLED IN 2000 FOOT DROP.—The sad news has been received by Mr. Oliver McNeill, of Summerside, that his two nephews, Messrs. Roy and Floyd McNeill of Tulare, South Dakota, were instantly killed in an aeroplane accident there, a few days ago. The father of the unfortunate young men who were the eldest sons in the family, Mr. Edward L. McNeill, is a native of North Rustico, P. E. I., from whence he went when quite young with his father, Mr. William H. McNeill, to the United States. Mr. Roy McNeill had been attending an aviation school in Illinois, for about one year and returned to his home in Tulare, S. D., by airplane with the pilot, Mr. Sylvester Cleberg, of Avon, Ill., the day before the accident. The following day the two young men, accompanied by Mr. Floyd McNeill, went for a short flight and all three were instantly killed when their airplane failed to come out of an attempted loop and fell about two thousand feet. Witnesses said the plane attempted a loop at an altitude of about 2000 feet but that it failed to right itself after making the first part of the loop. No detailed account of the accident has as yet been received. The two brothers were aged 32 and 30 respectively and were unmarried. There are left to mourn, besides their parents, one sister and two younger brothers.—S.
