Second Quarter: Lesson 1: Mark 1:14-18: 29:1-5: April 3 1927. Golden Text: Come ye after me and I will make you to become fishers of men. Mark 1:17. PETER BECOMES A DISCIPLE OF JESUS

(The story) Rugged, rash, repentant, swinging from ardent cowardice to immortal courage, shifting and crystallized into adamant, St. Peter's appeal is strong and universal just because he is so very human. It was enough to insure immortality to one man just to have introduced such a character to Jesus. Nothing more is recorded of Andrew or needed to be. Luther's 'I can not not other' is the echo a thousand years after of Peter's 'we cannot speak'.

His questions led to the speaking of the parables and the explanation of others. The very fact that Peter's name in one form or another appears fifty times in the New Testament is enough to indicate the large share he had in Apostolic history. Next to Jesus and Paul Peter's words and actions fill the largest space in the New Testament.

However one may think of the Christian Church as an institution all must admit that it has had an unparalleled influence upon the intellectual and ethical development of the human race. It is St. Peter's distinction that he was foremost in the saying of the four gospels of that Church.

St. Peter was one of the inner group of the apostles, sole witness of the greatest miracles, and of Jesus' mortal passion in Gethsemane. He was first to recognize Jesus' messianic claim and to acknowledge it in explicit terms.

But all this brilliant and useful career had its germ cell in St. Peter's immediate and entire obedience to Jesus' call "Come after me and I will make you to become a fisher of men." "Straightway" all the tools of the craft which he made his living were laid aside forever for that supreme and divine calling which has so many points of resemblance to that of the fisherman. With what admirable skill St. Peter was to cast the net on the dry of Pentecost!

What a multitude to inclose! No wonder of that net breaking!

UNDER THE STUDY LAMP Jesus is still calling not mere followers but followers who will become fishers of men. His kingdom is recaptured in that way and perpetuated in that way and in no other. This is the way the apostolic succession is maintained.

The call to discipleship includes the call to be in turn a maker of disciples. If this was universally recognized and practiced we could estimate the rate at which the Kingdom of Heaven would increase. The call of St. Peter was sudden in appearance only. He had been with and listened to the Forerunner of Jesus. There had been a preliminary call from Jesus himself. From this Peter had been dismissed to think it over in his old environment. He had come to his conclusion, his mind was already made up when he received his second call. He does not think of St. Peter as an author.
