Killed His Wife In New York Apartment

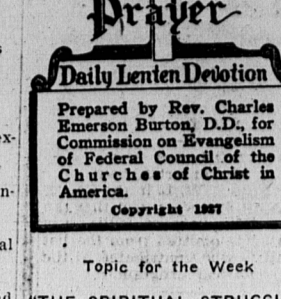

Ottawa Govt. May Purchase Danish Embassy

OTTAWA, Ont., April 5.—Acquisition of an embassy for Hon. V. Massey, envoy extraordinary and minister plenipotentiary for Canada in Washington is under consideration by the dominion cabinet. According to information reaching Ottawa the Canadian minister in the United States capital has an opportunity to purchase the Danish embassy at a cost of \$350,000. This is said to be less than half the original cost of buildings and furnishings, and it is understood the opportunity arises from the fact that the Danish ambassador has been recalled. It is claimed that it would be more economical for the Canadian government to acquire the Danish embassy in Washington than to continue paying rent for the quarters now occupied by Mr. Massey.

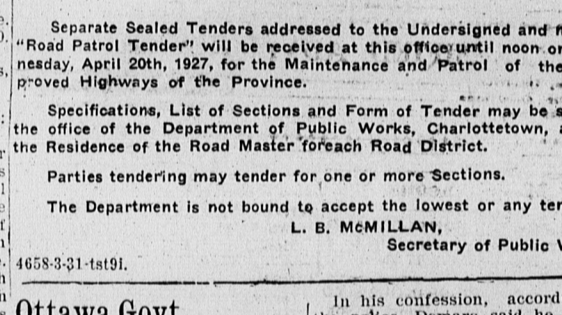
