LOCAL OPTION IN ONTARIO.

A brisk campaign is going on in the Province of Ontario the object of which is on the one side to secure the requisite three-fifths vote to refuse liquor licenses, and on the other hand to maintain the existing order of things.

One gathers from reading these advertisements that public sentiment on the temperance question is much less advanced in Ontario than in the Eastern Provinces. Here in Prince Edward Island our daily newspaper, Liberal, Conservative or Independent will print a liquor advertisement.

In this advertisement one J.R. Brown, said to be the secretary of the local board of trade, affirms that local option is detrimental to the best interests of the town from a business point of view; that it has created discord by setting one portion of the town against the other, and from a moral or temperance standpoint is the worst blow the temperance cause has ever received.

We have passed that stage in Prince Edward Island at least. The great mass of our people are no longer credulous enough to believe that a corner grocery or a liquor saloon can do as much business behind closed doors as it can do with open doors.

Last week, with Christmas falling in mid-week, the season specially tending to conviviality, there were just three arrests for drunkenness in Charlottetown. Two of these were non-residents and the third was an old offender.

Prohibition in Charlottetown notoriously produces precisely the opposite results to those charged against local option in Owen Sound. It produces peace, order, sobriety and prosperity in a measure before unknown, and no man of reputation here publicly says otherwise.

so favorable results. If not, we strongly advise our Ontario friends to bend their utmost efforts to secure the adoption of prohibition. It will require a stiff fight, no doubt to carry it in the face of the rich and powerful distilling, brewing and trading interests but experience here has proved that with the law vigorously enforced against it the liquor traffic readily loses the fighting power it formerly had and has become utterly discredited.

Ontario has mainly given a Conservative majority since Confederation. This was true of the elections of 1867, 1878, 1882, 1887, 1891, 1901 and 1904. In three elections, 1872, 1874 and 1896 the majority was Liberal. In 1874 the Liberal majority in Ontario was 40; in 1878 the Conservative majority was 32. These were extreme cases.

Synopsis of Canadian North-West HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS.

A NY even numbered section of Dominion Land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, excepting 8 and 90, not to exceed 160 acres, may be homesteaded by any person who is the head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one quarter section 80 acres, more or less. Applications for entry must be made in person by the applicant at a Dominion Land Agency or Subagency for the district in which the land is situated. For every man, woman, or child, he must have an acre of land, or a portion of an acre, in the vicinity of his homestead. The homesteaded land must be improved by him or by his wife, or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of any intending homesteader. The homesteader is required to perform the homestead duties under one of the following plans: (1) At least six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year for three years. (2) A homesteader may, if he so desire, perform the required residence duties by his living or farming land owned solely by him not less than eighty (80) acres in extent, in the vicinity of his homestead. The homesteaded land will not meet this requirement. (3) If the father or mother, if the father deceased, or of his homesteaded land, has a residence on farming land owned solely by him, not less than eighty (80) acres in extent, in the vicinity of his homestead, and the homesteaded land is owned by him or by his wife, or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of any intending homesteader. (4) The term "residence" in the two preceding paragraphs is defined as meaning not more than nine miles in a direct line, a continuous width of road allowances crossed in the measurement. (5) A homesteader intending to perform his residence duties in accordance with the above plans, if he has a partner or on farming land owned by himself, must notify the Agent in the district of such intention. Six months notice in writing should be given to the Commissioner of Dominion Lands at Ottawa, of intention to apply for a homestead. W. W. COPE, Deputy of the Minister of the Interior.
