HUGHES DON'T WANT PRO-GERMAN SUPPORT.

NEW YORK, Oct. 24.—Charles E. Hughes tonight told an audience that he did not want the support of "any one who has any interest superior to that of the United States, who would not instantly champion the right of interest of America against any country whatsoever, who wants immunity for foreign aggression, or would have the power of this nation held captive to any foreign influences or swayed by alien machinations." This is the first public utterance of repudiation of pro-German support.

Church Union

When Church Union comes, will the old calling system disappear, or will present relationships between ministers and congregations be interrupted? Both will be conserved. The utmost care will be taken in every department of the work to retain the practices now prevailing in the different denominations.

What is the arrangement proposed? Congregations or ministers desiring change apply, through the Presbytery, to the Settlement Committee. The changes sought will ordinarily be made at the end of the Church or Conference year.

In anticipation of a vacancy at the end of the year a congregation may call or invite any minister of the Church, and may submit other names, if their first request cannot be granted.

If it is found impossible to issue the matter at the end of the year, a further period not yet fixed will be allowed during which a call may be issued.

But to guard against long and injurious vacancies, if a congregation fails to take action at the end of this further period, the Settlement Committee is empowered to make an appointment. But as, at the end of any year, application may be made for change, this appointment, if unsatisfactory to either party, may then come up for review.

If on account of death or some other emergency, a vacancy occurs during the year, Presbytery will confer with the charge and may thereafter arrange a supply to the end of the year.

It is important to remember that existing arrangements will not be interfered with. Though a way of making such changes as are necessary is provided, it is expressly stated that there is to be no time limit to the pastorate.

The whole arrangement is thoroughly democratic. The Settlement Committee is the servant of ministers and congregations desiring readjustments of relationship, and is expressly enjoined to comply as far as possible with the wishes of all parties concerned.

The ideal that is contemplated in the Basis of Union is the continuous supply of every pastoral charge, and the continuous employment of every effective minister. Pastoral relationship will continue as long as they are mutually satisfactory.

COMPLIMENTS FROM FRENCH COMMANDER.

PARIS, Oct. 28.—General Nivelle, the French commander at Verdun, has addressed the following proclamation to General Mangin and the officers and men of his command, who participated in the recent French advance north of that city. "Officers and men of General Mangin's group: In four hours, by a magnificent assault, you wrested at one blow from a powerful enemy, ground northeast of Verdun bristling with obstacles and fortifications, which he took eight months to tear from us bit by bit, at the cost of desperate efforts and considerable sacrifices. You have added fresh and splendid glory to the flags of the army of Verdun. In the name of the army I thank you. You have deserved well of your country."

SALONIKI, October 29.—An official statement from the headquarters of the British army issued today reads: On the Dolra front nothing is reported; on the Struma fronts strong hostile patrols were driven back by our advanced troops in the neighborhood of Kalendra.

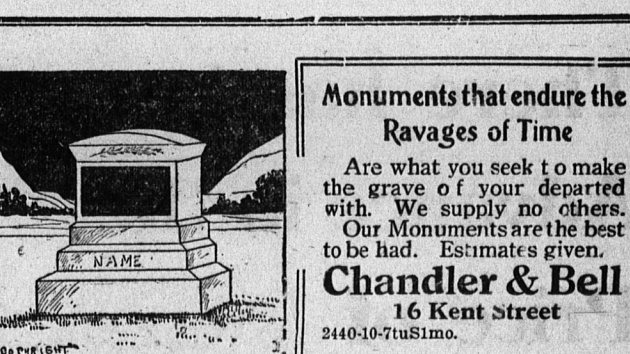
