SOLDIERS' CIVIL RE-ESTABLISHMENT

Through co-operation with the Labor Department the Information and Service Branch of the Department of Soldiers' Civil Re-establishment has opened employment offices in 39 centres throughout Canada.

At one time it was permissible, owing to labor shortage, for firms having vacancies in certain skilled trades unable to be filled in Canada to import help, with the sanction of the Immigration authorities, from the United States.

The method adopted is complete and harmonious co-operation between the Department of Soldiers' Civil Re-establishment, the Department of Labor and the Immigration authorities.

The Government proposes with the aid of the soldier laborer to create farms, build houses, barns and fences and get the land under cultivation. Up to date, however, no preliminary survey work has been done and before she can develop adequate schemes, it will be necessary for Congress to pass enabling legislation.

The returned men who man the employment offices run by the Information and Service Branch of the Department of Soldiers' Civil Re-establishment, are full of enthusiasm and keen in the service of their fellows.

There are several forms of land tenure in New South Wales, South Australia and Queensland, no free hold title is given. The settler pays a rental of about 1 1/2 per cent of the value of the land and receives a perpetual lease which is inheritable.

Under the Land Settlement Act of 1912, amended by the Act of 1917, Crown Land is made available for settlement in South Africa and leased usually for five years with an option of purchasing at the price fixed when the lease is made.

The purchase price of the holding may be paid at any time providing that all conditions of the lease have been complied with; but, notwithstanding such payment the settler is not entitled to obtain transfer of his holding into his name until after a period of ten years from the commencement of the lease.

Settlers holding leases may obtain assistance in the way of an advance of \$1250 for stock, implements and other equipment. These advances are repayable within five years, interest being at the rate of 4 1/2 per cent.

Provision is made for the purchase of private land selected by the settler up to \$7500, the settler paying one-fifth of the purchase price. The cost of the transfer is borne by the settler and interest at the rate of 4 per cent is charged.

In Southern Rhodesia the British South Africa Co. offers 500,000 acres free to returned soldiers and sailors. The holdings are dependent on the fertility of the soil and local conditions average between 1500 and 2000 acres.

It is provided that the applicants must be British Subjects of European descent from overseas, men who were not at the outbreak of war domiciled in South Africa.

NEW ZEALAND

The Board has power to provide agricultural training for inexperienced but otherwise qualified men and will pay allowances up to \$55 a month, for the sustenance of himself and his dependents, the amount to be dependent upon the number of children.

The Board has secured specially favorable prices on farm requirements, and purchases livestock of good quality for resale to soldier settlers at cost prices.

This is briefly what the Land Settlement Scheme means to the returned soldier. These privileges are extended to all Canadian, Imperial and Colonial Forces who served outside the country in which they enlisted, and to residents of Canada before the war who served in Allied Forces.

GENERAL OBSERVATIONS

It is well to note that Great Britain had experience in the subdivision of estates in Ireland and settling thereon the tenants as owners. Australia and New Zealand had land settlement schemes which had been in operation for years.

Centuries ago Great Britain exhausted her Crown Lands which were available for settlement without considerable development work.

Today, however, available lands which can readily be settled have largely passed from the Crown and it has been necessary, therefore, to inaugurate an entirely new policy which has for its object the making of lands available for settlement.

WHAT'S A PEDIGREE?

Pedigree is a record showing the animals that have in succession entered into the breeding of the individual. It shows, too, that the animal belongs to a distinct breed, possessing, therefore, the prepotency of that breed, and in addition to this possession it guarantees a certain degree of individual prepotency dependent upon the excellence and known prepotency of the ancestors on each side of the pedigree.

The sires should be of equal merit, and the most important point is to see that they are of known purity of blood and individual excellence; also that upon neither side is there an objectionable or the presence of a sire or dam noted for unsoundness or other objectionable trait, character or should be taken into account. The pedigree is comparatively valueless unless the breeder and seller are not feature. Furthermore the character of the man back of the pedigree for integrity; nor is a pedigree a sufficient criterion of merit or an apology for individual imperfection or unsoundness. The animal should be there is a long line of excellent ancestors upon both sides of its pedigree, there will be good reason to expect that it will, with considerable fidelity, transmit to its progeny the true characteristics of its breed, those of its family and those of its individuality.

In some instances a individual with a long line of reputable ancestors is itself a comparatively poor individual, yet may prove an impressive sire, or dam, and, on general principles, the somewhat different individual that has a fine line of ancestors, as shown by its pedigree, is greatly to be preferred to a scrub,
