Conference Closed Saturday Night—Premier Will Ask to Have B. N. A. Act Amended—Provincial Premier Get Practically All They Asked For—Travelers' Tax to Be Withdrawn.

OTTAWA, Oct. 14.—(Special)—The provincial conference closed Saturday evening with the announcement that the Premier was willing to ask the Imperial Parliament to amend the B. N. A. Act in such a way that provincial subsidies could be increased on a basis of present population to the extent of \$2,782,000 a year and to provide for further increase in population.
