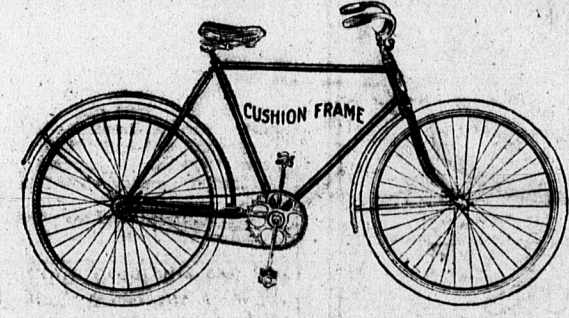
There passed away at Boughton Island on April 15th, James R. Allen in the 24th year of his age.
