By a special wire received by James McMillan, Charlottetown, Saturday it was learned that McGill had won the Inter-collegiate Championships of Canada, defeating Toronto the previous night in a fast and furious game of hockey which resulted in a score of 10-4.

Word was received in Charlottetown on Saturday of the games in New Glasgow and Halifax in the Maritime Province Hockey Association and omitted from Saturday's issue. The Moncton Vics in New Glasgow, after the best game of the entire series, defeated the New Glasgow Cubs by a score of 6-3 and in Halifax the Socials were defeated by the Crescents 8-7.

The Victorias of Charlottetown will likely arrange with the New Glasgow Shamrocks for a series of games in the Arena shortly. As the Shamrocks are not winners in a league they cannot compete for the Starr Trophy under the rules, but the games would be interesting, if only for the sake of a comparison of mainland and P. E. I. amateur hockeyists.

The Charlottetown Hockey League was opened on Saturday night before a fair audience at the Arena rink. The first game was between West Kent School team and the second Prince of Wales team. Both teams played good, fast hockey with fairly good team work.

The game was very even, West Kent winning by the score of 3 to 2. The Y. M. C. A. senior team were defeated in the senior game by the first Prince of Wales. No faster game has been seen in the Arena this winter. The game was fast and clean, only two penalties being charged up the entire game. Jack Gordon for the Y. M. C. A. started the scoring after two minutes' play, on a pretty combination. At the end of ten minutes of fast work A. Rattenbury scored for P. W. C., followed two minutes later by L. Campbell. In the last minute of the first half Rattenbury again scored, making the score 3 to 1.

The second half opened with good fast hockey and after one minute of play L. Campbell put in the fourth for P. W. C. At about the middle of the last half McCarey scored for P. W. C. and Rattenbury followed 30 seconds later with the final tally for P. W. C. Nash after a pretty run passed to Warburton who scored for Y. M. C. A. The game ended with the score 6 to 2. Both games were clean and were finished at 10.40 p. m. It was the first time that all the Y. M. C. A. have played together and will show up much stronger by the next game.
