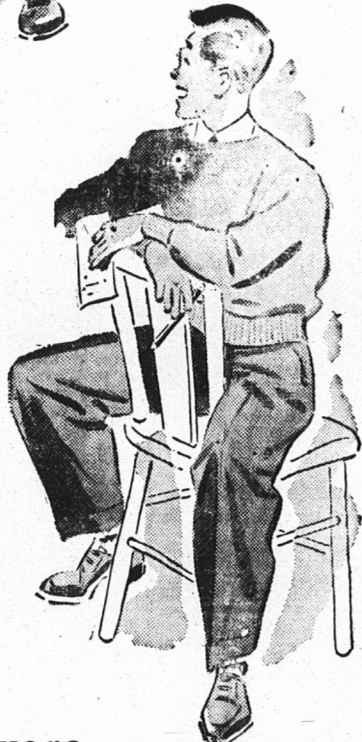

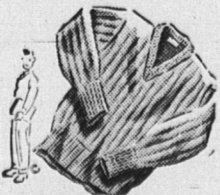

P. E. I. Physician**

"Thirty-two years ago, a young Scotchman, with apple red cheeks, coal black hair and a determined set to his chin, strayed into this valley from far away Prince Edward Island, washed by the waters of the gulf of St. Lawrence. His trim appearance, the unmistakable scent of medicine and the business-like small satchel, betrayed his profession.

Sturdy sagebrush that shaded a man on a horse covered this area, interrupted here an there by rectangles of new ground turned up, dotted with the homes of the pioneers. The breath of life was being breathed into the new little town of Aberdeen. A canal whose fresh made banks wound a long and sinuous course, trickled life-giving waters on rich soil ripe for the seeding. On such a stage and such a scene did Dr. Mackinnon walk into the hearts and lives of a people.

"Those early winters were snowy and cold, the springs long and chill, with floods of water rushing in from the desert. The sun shone bright and hot on the young medico in the dusty buggy; perhaps he frowned a bit, for the nights were mere catnaps between calls, what with the pioneers having babies, an epidemic of typhoid raging and the general run of accidents that trail in the wake of a new country.

"But he had dedicated his life to the saving of other lives and what mattered if he did sacrifice his own health? Besides, a bride had come all the way from the little Island of Prince Edward to make his home happier with the solid comforts that his strenuous life demanded. Soon he was known far up and down the valley for his expertise in diagnosis, his studious ways, his sincerity of speaking and a dogged persistence in combat with disease. He easily became our leading citizen, for his faith in the country was only matched by the love of the community for their faithful w'se counsellor in times of need. Many are the stories told of lives saved, of tides turned, of battles won by this country doctor.

Though these days find him not actively practicing his profession, yet he is still serving in his highest capacity as a consultant to his able young assistant, Dr. Harms. One thing more is demanded of him by this community. When he gains his strength sufficiently, we hope he will take time and inclination to write his memoirs. Men of his experience have almost disappeared. And though it need not be written to be remembered in our times, it will prove a volume of interest and inspiration to the generations to come. For what you have done and your useful years ahead, Dr. Mackinnon, we salute you!

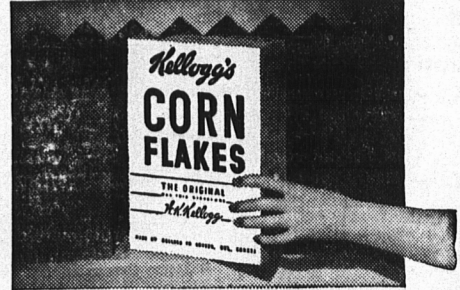
