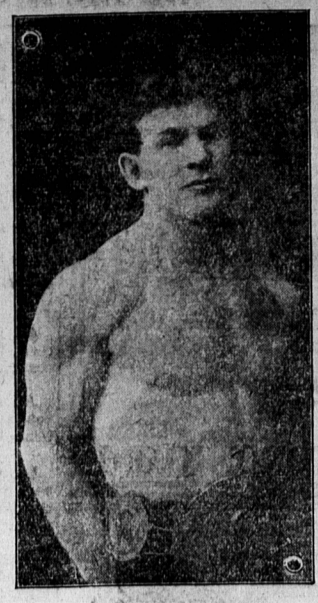

Oleanders Bloom the Year Round Myriad Wonders of the Submarine Plains Revealed.

The "Beautiful Bermudas" number about three hundred islands, covering an area of 24 square miles, the largest being Mainland, St. Georges, St. David's, Somerset and Ireland. Four of these are connected by bridges and causeways. The many smaller islets are scattered in picturesque, crescent-shaped irregularity. They are true islands of the sea, indestructible and triumphant, emblematic of the ceaseless struggle between wave and rock which never can be subdued. The climate is delightful at all seasons; rarely does the thermometer go below 60 degrees in winter or above 80 degrees in summer. Vegetation is very rapid and the soil is clad in a perpetual blanket of green. Viewed from the sea, they resemble dark green gardens growing in the water, sharply defined against a sapphire sky-the ideal blue of southern climes. The transparency of the water at Bermuda is remarkable. On a still day, the bottom, at depths of from 15 to 30 feet, can be distinctly seen, revealing the myriad wonders of the submarine plain. As the Guardian's guests drift over the shallow reefs by means of a specially built, glass bottomed boat, this new world is revealed. Purple sea fans wave in the currents of water; coral in an endless variety of lovely forms is there-the exquisite rose coral, the delicate star coral, branch coral, and the curious brain-stones, sponges, sea rods and other marine plants are seen, and most beautiful of all those living flowers of the sea, the anemones, in rose, orange, pink, brown, and all delicate shades. In and out among the grottoes and caves glide the magnificently covered fishes of tropical seas-blue angel fish, yellow canary fish, and fish of gold, silver, indigo, brightly tinted and curiously shaped.
