

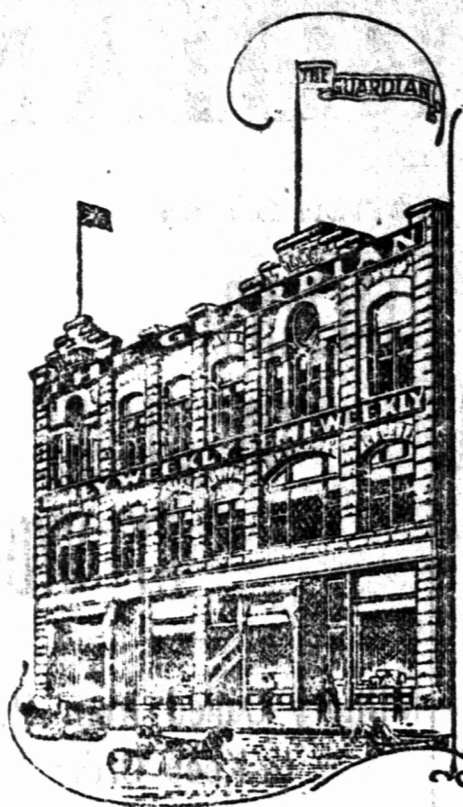

**THE NEW BRUNSWICK ELECTIONS.**

As was seen by The Guardian's full returns from all the constituencies in yesterday's issue, the New Brunswick Government was triumphantly sustained at the general election held on Saturday last. Thirty-three out of forty-three seats were carried by supporters of the Administration and there is little doubt that three more were added at the belated election in Gloucester County yesterday. The House will therefore be between three fourths and four fifths ministerial. The Government party is quite as large as its best friends could desire, and in fact is something larger than will be conducive to the best working of parliamentary institutions. Small as was the Opposition party in the late House two of the most influential of their number, Messrs Shaw of St John and Mott of Restigouche, were defeated in Saturday's battle.

In fact the Opposition members of the new House are a rather strange aggregation. Of the ten men who make up the total four are from Charlotte County, two from Sunbury, two from Northumberland and two from Carleton County. These counties are so situated that three of them are in touch with each other, Charlotte, Sunbury and Northumberland forming a belt across the centre of the Province from northeast to southwest, from the Maine border to Miramichi Bay. Six counties southeast of this belt are all solid for the Government. Five out of six counties northwest of the belt referred to are also solidly ministerial, the exception being Carleton which has divided its representation. The fact of Charlotte County returning four Opposition members is also largely accounted for by a difficulty that arose in forming a ticket for the Government which difficulty led to Hon Mr Hill retiring from the Government and heading a ticket opposed to the Ministry, all of whom were elected.

It was only in some parts of the Province that the election was fought out on federal party lines, and yet none the less the victory is largely a Liberal one. Premier Tweedie and Attorney General Pagsley were formerly Conservatives, but sometime since both had publicly announced their adhesion to the Liberal party. This really removed or transformed any Conservative element in the Government. The active part taken in the election and for the Government by Hon. A. G. Blair and the equally active interest taken by the Conservative dailies in opposing the Tweedie Administration make it look very much like a party battle. It is true, however that Senator Ellis with his influential Liberal newspaper, The Globe joined hands with the Opposition. This, we think, constituted an exception to the general rule, and that a very large proportion of the Liberal electors of the Province voted on the Ministerial side.

**N. S. EDUCATION.**

HALIFAX, Feb. 28.—A bill was introduced in the legislature yesterday to consolidate several rural sections in Annapolis county under the plan proposed by Sir William C. Macdonald of Montreal. It provides for the education of country children to a central graded school and the closing of outlying schools. The law may soon be made applicable to the whole province.

**N. S. CREW MUTINEED.**

HAVANA, Feb. 28.—The crew of the British brigantine Persia, of Windsor, N. S., which has arrived from Hantsport, N. S., at Bahia, Honé, mutinied today and attacked the captain, Cogswell, and the mate, Peter Hobleau, both Nova Scotians. The mate was so badly slashed in the abdomen that he is not expected to live. Captain Cogswell was badly out and bruised.
