CHICAGO, March 12—Boston Bruins defeated Chicago Black Hawks 8-3 here tonight in a National Hockey League game. Tonight's attendance swelled to 500,000 the total at N.H.L. games here this season.

## Joe Mahar Shoots Four Counters In Thrilling 8-6 Win

Led by Joe Mahar, Carl McDonald and Bernard Methot with a supporting cast lending brilliant support, Jackie Kane's S. D. U. hockey squad last night reached the pinnacle of intercollegiate hockey when they skated their way to the Maritime title with a thrilling 8-6 victory over the heavily backed St. Francis Xavier team from Antigonish, N. S.

Starting from behind to gain a 3-0 lead at the end of the first period the Saints shot three goals in the middle session to take a 6-3 lead; twice in the third period as the Xaverians applied the pressure Saints saw their lead dwindle to a solitary counter. As the final seconds ticked off the winners were hanging on grimly against the five x-b attacks of the visitors when suddenly Bernard Methot, who thudded forward and defenceman just after coming on the ice broke clear of the press to race right in on the Xaverian's goalie and slide the disc into the cage for the counter that clinched the game.

It was a thrilling finish to a thrilling game of hockey that kept upwards of 2000 fans in a wild state of excitement all during the encounter. Given only an outside chance to win Saints after losing an early lead in the first period suddenly sprang to life to take the play away from their favored opponents throughout the middle frame in the wide-open, fast skating struggle and in the manner in which they held off the smart Xaverians in the torrid third session will live long in the fans' memory.

As the final whistle blew the fans swarmed onto the ice to mob the victorious Saint Dunstan's team. It was scenes reminiscent of Big Four days and late last night the hockey-crazed S. D. U. students were still celebrating their squad's uphill victory.

Playing the best game of his hockey career mercury footed Joe Mahar last night led the Saints attack with four brilliantly executed goals, scoring three in a row in the second period and being a lower of strength defensively, Carl McDonald had two counters, one on a penalty shot, Porky McDougall scored the opener while Reg Rodgers' contribution late in the final session put the clincher on the title for the Saints.
