At Woodstock

Dr. Prior and party today are at Woodstock, N. B., where an experiment is being conducted to ascertain whether the potato beetle can be artificially removed from potatoes.

The test starts with a demonstration of potato digging at the farm of Mayor Alfred Pagnier, Woodstock. Following this, the potatoes will be given an "application" of beetles and then placed in a new machine which has brushes and blowers, said to make an efficient job of cleaning the tubers of insect pests.

Are Optimistic

Dominion and Provincial agricultural officials feel certain they can convince Dr. Prior that the potato beetle can be prevented from entering shipments, and consequently that the embargo will be lifted by the British Government.
