TORONTO, April 14—(CP)—The stock market was depressed today, possibly by the political developments in France, and all four index groups lost ground. Both mining groups set new index lows for the year, the golds going to their lowest in 10 years. Selling increased on the drop and the aggregate turnover of 195,000 shares was the heaviest since March 24.

Finance

NEW YORK, April 14—(AP)—Stock market prices today dropped to the lowest average level since April, 1933, under selling brought out by the news of Pierre Laval's return to power in the Vichy government.

The Associated Press 60-stock composite dropped 7 1/2 points at 334. Of an average of 789 issues traded, 60 declined, 58 advanced and 131 were unchanged. Canadian stocks showed a general fractional decline. International Nickel and Hiram Walkers lost 1 1/2 points, Lake Shore Mines, Distillers Seagram 1 1/4, Canadian Pacific 3/8, Brazilian Traction, Ford of Canada "A" 1-8. Quoted for the first time in some weeks Bell Telephone of Canada gained 3/4 and Distillers Seagram preferred 1 3/4 points to 78 1/8.

A long list of stocks reached new lows. Included were U.S. Steel, Bethlehem, Republic, Crucible, Youngstown Sheet, Boeing, Douglas, Anaconda, Kennecott, West-Union, N.Y. Central, Southern Railway, Southern Railway and South Puerto Rico Sugar. Down a point or more were American Can, Chrysler, Sears Roebuck, Harvester, Eastman, Philip Morris, DuPont, Santa Fe Union Pacific, Atlantic Coast Line and American Sugar.

MONTREAL, April 14—(CP)—There were 62 cattle, 4 sheep, 782 hogs and 1,804 calves for sale on the two Montreal livestock markets today. Calves were strong to 25 cents or more higher, other kinds of livestock were steady.

Butcher cows ranged from \$6 to \$8. Canners and cutters \$4.50 to \$5.75 and common bulls \$5.50 to \$7.50.

Calves were strong to 25 cents or more higher quality considered. Veals ranged from \$8 for very common light kinds to \$12 for good veals. There were no logs. The bulk

of the calves were sold in mixed lots between \$7.75 and \$9.50 averaging close to \$9.15. Drinkers were \$6.50 to \$8.

Hogs were \$15.25 to \$15.40 for B-1 dressed, \$14.75 to \$15.10 per hog premium with discounts on off grades. Sows were \$9 to \$9.75 live weight.
