Facilities Bag Down Under Copy Avalanche

GANDER AIRPORT, Nfld., Sept. 23—(CP Cable)—Lack of communication facilities, of co-ordination between sources of information and of transportation proved to be the three major headaches of newspapermen covering events here following the crash of a Belgian airliner last Wednesday with a loss of 26 lives.

About 25 newspapermen and photographers came from Canada and the United States on the assignment and they found their copy could be sent by telephone on two teletypes operated by the Newfoundland Post Office Department.

Induction of Rev. R. J. Berlis

MONTREAL, Sept. 21—In the presence of a congregation of over 300 Rev. Rudolph J. Berlis, B.A., B.D., was inducted Friday night as minister of the Church of St. Andrew and St. Paul, Montreal.

Succeeding the Rev. Dr. George Donald, who served for 20 years as minister of the largest Presbyterian congregation in the province, Mr. Berlis was ordained minister in the recent war as chaplain, first with the Canadian Forestry Corps, then with the Black Watch (R.H.R.) of Canada. Before his war service, the new minister was assistant minister at the Church of St. Andrew and St. Paul in 1939 and 1940.

The charge to the minister was made by Rev. C. Ritchie Bell, B.A., B.D., and the charge to the congregation by Rev. Dr. David Scott. Benediction was offered by Mr. Berlis at the end of the ceremony.
