That well known representative of the C. P. Railway—Geo. H. Hamac, accompanied by Chas. F. He still possesses all the charm of other years and all who know him were glad of the opportunity to greet him and know that he is well. They leave for the mainland this morning.

Produce was moving rapidly on the City market yesterday. Dealers were paying thirty-five cents a bush for potatoes, fifty-five for black oats and fifty for white. The hay market was dull, loose hay selling for fifty to fifty-five cents a ton, while pressed straw sold at thirty cents a ton. Loose butter at six dollars a ton. The butter and egg market was weak, butter being at eighteen and twenty cents a lb. and eggs at sixteen and one-half to seventeen cents a doz. Strawberries were sold at three boxes for twenty-five cents.

The July term of the Supreme Court opened at Georgetown yesterday, with Chief Justice Sullivan presiding. Twenty-four grand jurors responded to their summons, but as the law only allows twenty-three jury to be sworn the last man summoned was excused from attending. John G. Sterns was chosen foreman. There being no criminal business Chief Justice Sullivan was presented by the Sheriff with the customary white gloves. The jury after being charged by his Lordship visited the goal and shortly afterwards was discharged. The court then adjourned for recess and the docket was called. The first case was an action for ejectment brought by George J. McCormack of Souris against Matthew and McLean Ltd., to recover possession of part of the land upon which the Souris skating rink is situated. The plaintiff proved his title to the disputed land and at the close of the case the Chief Justice gave judgment for all the land claimed. Gaudet and McCallum for the plaintiff and Fraser for the defendant. The case of Gunn vs. Clark will come on before the Chief Justice and a jury.
