VICE AND ALL CRIME

White Cross Society of Half a Million.

WILL BATTLE FOR GOOD

A Mammoth Scheme to Forward the Brotherhood of Man.

(New York Journal.)

The White Cross Army of the United States is the name of an organization, which, though in existence for more than four years west of the Mississippi, operating principally in Colorado, Nebraska and other Far Western States, with a membership of half a million, has just been chartered by the Secretary of State of New Jersey. Its purpose is to fight vice and crime all over the world.

Just what this Army is can best be told by the father of the scheme, Rev. I. N. Merrifield, commander-in-chief of the army, who some years ago was widely known as "the boy preacher of the West," and who ten years ago assisted Rev. Dr. R. S. MacArthur, with a mission of Calvary Baptist Church in this city.

"All sorts of remedies have been suggested for the disjointed times," says General Merrifield, "but the great White Cross Army of the United States goes to the root of all vice and crime.

"For the last five years the generals and staff officers have been preparing this federation of churches, charities and reforms. Instead of trying to bring about the salvation of drunkards, unfortunate women and criminals by mere talk, this great crusade will seek to reform them by purity of environment and heredity. Over a million colonists from congested cities will be given homes and permanent employment by the White Cross Army in the fertile countries about the Gulf of Mexico.

A WORLDWIDE CRUSADE.

"The worldwide crusade is absolutely philanthropic. All the officials and soldiers in its charity work are unsalaried. Every dollar of profits and subscriptions must be devoted to the common weal of man.

BOY SPANKED IN COURT.

NEWARK, April 6.—As a penalty for smashing a fence owned by John Cheestam, of Chestnut and Hoyt streets, Kearny, Augustus Winters, 15 Antonio Brisco 14 and Adam Appleyard 14, were sentenced Wednesday by Recorder Jacobs to spankings in court.

Winters and Brisco were walloped by their fathers. Mrs. Appleyard signed an order directing Chief of Police Tolson to spank her boy. The chief carried out instruction satisfactorily.

Howling and weeping the prisoners were then discharged.

WOMEN FOR SOUTH AFRICA.

NEW YORK, April 8.—The Tribune's London correspondent says: "A rather unexpected result has followed Mr. Chamberlain's recent speech in support of the scheme for sending women out to South Africa at the conclusion of the war.

An enormous number of letters have been received from women eager to emigrate, and reluctant to wait till hostilities are ended. One woman, who wrote direct to Lord Salisbury, said: "I was prepared to go out at once with her mother and sisters, but she indicated no particular sphere of usefulness." Another wrote to the Colonial Office in behalf of herself and a few other "first-class lady barbers." Naturally, the Colonial Office authorities are doing their utmost to discourage applications from women other than those who are self-dependent, and girls of the servant type are urgently advised not to go out at all. It is very doubtful whether there will be any openings for them, and the public funds cannot be used for granting free passages to the Cape.

AUTHORITATIVE INFORMATION.

We are informed, from an authoritative source, that the decision has been made by the Government to render such aid as will insure the immediate completion of that portion of the Nova Scotia Southern Railway already graded, viz., from New Germany to Caledonia. Deliberations are under way which will, without doubt, result in a satisfactory route to the whole of Queen's County in particular, and the Province in general.

OUR CANADIAN RAILWAYS

More Miles of Railroad Per Head Than any Other Country in the World.

Our Consul-General at Montreal has just made a report on Canadian railroads which contributes interestingly to the stock of popular information. Of the 17,637 miles of railroad now in operation in the still thinly settled territory of the Dominion all but 66 miles have been built since 1850. Even as late as 1860, after the Grand Trunk was built, the total mileage was but 2,033 miles. Within forty years, therefore, Canada, whose total population to-day is only 5,500,000,

has constructed 15,600 miles of new railroads. Proportionately to population Canada has more miles of railroad and a larger investment of capital in railroads than any other country in the world. If the United States had 265,000 miles of railroad it would have the equivalent of Canada's 17,637 miles relatively to its population which is about fifteen times as large. But the total railroad mileage of the Union is 187,731 miles. With only 4,000 miles less

than the United Kingdom and two-thirds of the total mileage of the colossal Russian Empire including Finland and more than half as much as the combined mileage of all the countries included in the German Empire, Canada would almost seem to have overdone her railroad construction. Of the total capital invested in the Dominion railway system, which is close to \$1,000,000,000 over \$200,000,000 or one-fifth, represents public aid in the form of subsidies. The net earnings on this vast investment last year were less than 2 1/2 per cent. And as Canada grows quite slowly it is easy to understand that, as our Consul-General reports, "the continued expansion of the subsidy system is awakening alarm among the taxpayers."

NORTH SYDNEY NOTES.

NETON SYDNEY, April 9.—A movement with extremely influential support, is on foot here to induce the Dominion government to use every effort for the Duke of Cornwall and suite to pass right through by the C. P. R. and then to come through Cape Breton, leaving North Sydney en route for Newfoundland.
