Expectations Of Heavy Expenditure In Armaments Boosts New York Market

(By FREDERICK GARDNER) (Associated Press Financial Writer) NEW YORK, Jan. 4 (AP)—Spurred by growing expectations of heavy armaments spending, buying forces pushed up selected stocks 1 to 5 points generally in today's market. There were isolated advances of 9 or so.

Steels and aircraft, which would be among the principal beneficiaries if congress enacts a "big navy" program, were in the forefront of the forward tilt.

Exhibiting strength were motors, coppers, electrical equipments, rubbers, oils, tobacco and a wide assortment of specialties.

Fluctuations tended forwards on a sluggish Canadian list. International nickel advanced 2 5-8 points to 45 3-8 and walkers 1-4 to 41-

1-2 as Dome, McIntyre, Marconi, Hollinger, Lake Shore and Massey Harris steadied fractions.

The principal fly in the day's optimistic ointment, however, was the relative lightness of volume in comparison with the board recovery. The ticker tape frequently was at a standstill and transfers totalled 942, 180 shares as against 916,500 the day before. The associated press average of 60 issues was up 1.3 points net at 44.2, the best day's performance since Nov. 7.

Livestock

MONTREAL, Jan. 4 (CP)—Hog prices strengthened in early livestock dealings today with calves in good demand at firm prices. Cattle held unchanged under light offerings while sheep and lambs were inactive at unchanged levels. Receipts cattle 390; calves 196; sheep and lambs 31; hogs 582.

Majority of cattle offerings were common to medium cows and brought \$2.75 to \$4 for butchers while canners and cutters went from \$2 to \$2.75 with common bulls from \$3 to \$4.

Good veal calves made \$10 with the bulk sold in mixed lots at \$8-50 to \$9.25. Common lights went down to \$7 with a few grassers at \$4.50.

On lambs section, good ewes and wethers brought \$8 with culs and bucks picked out at \$6. Lambs sold in mixed lots made \$6.75.

Bacon hogs, fed and watered, sold at \$9 on former contract while fresh sales brought \$9.25. Selects drew the usual \$1 premium with the regular cuts taken on off grades. Sows sold from \$6.25 to \$7.

MONTREAL, Jan. 4 (CP)—Pound Sterling slipped 15-16 cents on Montreal foreign exchanges today to \$5.00 7/32 while the United States dollar eased 1-64 cent to 1-64 premium. The French franc remained unchanged at 3-40 cents.

NEW YORK, Jan. 4 (AP)—Leading European currencies declined in terms of the United States dollar today, paring yesterday's broad gains.

The British Pound Sterling was 5-8 of a cent at \$5 00 5-16 and the Netherlands guilder down .06 of a cent. The French franc lost .01 1-2 of a cent at 3.39 5-8, the Belgian franc .01 1-2 of a cent, the Swiss franc .01 1-12 of a cent, and the Canadian dollar was up 1-64 of a cent at 99 31-32.

No. 4 closed unchanged to 1-8 lower. Sales were 5,150 tons.

Refined was unchanged locally at 4.65 to 4.85 for fine granulated, although one of the southern refiners reduced prices 10 points from 4.85 to 4.75. Demand was still light and limited to nearby requirements.
