WAR AGAINST TANGO

NEW YORK, June 1.—The crusade against tango restaurants and cabarets of Broadway, where merriment holds sway, was begun yesterday with the arraignment in police court of the proprietor of one restaurant and the manager of another, on charges of giving theatrical performances without a license. So elaborate is the cabaret at each of the places, it was charged, that it has developed into a theatrical entertainment.

THE GREATEST GUNS AND THEIR RANGE.

Germany's weapon is the almost mythical 16.8-inch gun or howitzer, supposed to throw a 2000-pound shell something between seven and nine miles. Doubts have been expressed as to this monster's existence, and according to one high authority, only two at most have been made, and perhaps these have not yet been fired. For they require to be bolted down to a solid cement platform, prepared long beforehand. To be sure, our spymasters have discovered numerous platforms of the kind ready prepared and scattered up and down our own country under the pretext of house foundations and factory floors. But spymasters see Germans in the moon to which they bay. We have seen, however, an apparently genuine photograph of an Austrian 12-inch siege howitzer, weighing 28 tons with its carriage, and throwing shells of over 1000 lbs. We also hear of a Krupp 11.2-inch "mortar" used on the field, a 16-inch howitzer throwing a 760-pound shell at a range of about six miles, an 8.4-inch 4.13-inch (apparently one of the commonest), and various other sizes.

The funeral which took place on Thursday at St. Bonaventure's church was followed by a large concourse of people who came to pay their last tribute to the departed one, who after receiving the last rites of the Holy Catholic Church was laid in his last resting place to await the glorious resurrection. A sorrowing wife and ad family are left to mourn the loss of a devoted and loving father to all of whom the Guardian extends sincere sympathy.—S.

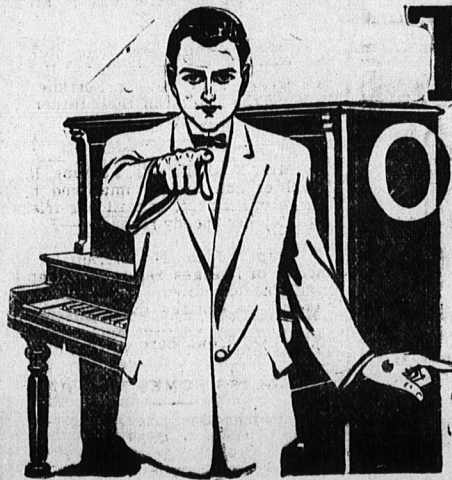

ROYAL PALACES ARE USED FOR HOSPITALS

ROME, June 1.—Great preparations are being made all over Rome for the reception of wounded soldiers from the front. Both Queen Helena and the Dowager Queen Margherita have risen nobly to the occasion. Queen Helena has offered the immense first floor of the Quirinal Palace, where the monarchs live when in Rome, for a hospital, and also will instal hospitals in the royal palaces at Verona, Caserta and other places. The Queen will personally supervise these hospitals. That she is an admirable nurse was proved by her ministrations to the people during the days that followed the Messina earthquake. Dowager Queen Margherita has given for a hospital a house which stands in the grounds of her own palace domain. The Red Cross has inspected the royal quarters tendered and found them admirably suited for hospitals, with the exception of some of the rooms in the Quirinal which are hung with tapestries.

LEAVES PULPIT TO BE SOLDIER

HAMPTON, May 1.—On Sunday morning, in the Methodist Church, the pastor, Rev. E. H. Creed, in place of the usual sermon, announced that on Friday he had offered himself as a recruit to the 55th battalion to fill any position which might be assigned to him. On Saturday he passed the medical examination and was assigned to the stretcher bearer corps of the 55th Regiment, for duty in the hospital service. He laid before his church the reasons and why he had taken this course and while regretting the surrender of the ties which bound him to the ministerial office, he felt that his training and experience thoroughly fitted him for his new duties. In the performance of which great opportunities for usefulness would be constantly opening before him. His commanding officers had granted him a furlough until July 1st, so that he would still be with his people for a few weeks, during which time he would ask the conference to grant him a vacation during the war.
