BRIDGES IN THE FIRST DISTRICT.

Editor Guardian: Sir:—There appears to be some misunderstanding in the First District of Queen's with reference to the Public Works' report of certain bridges in No. 2 Division of Queen's County, and a word of explanation may be in order. Under the Act, McDonald's Bridge are included seven different bridges, as follows:—

1st.—McDonald's bridge at Kelly's Cross. There was expended upon it and paid to Peter Trainor \$7,000 and \$5,500.

2nd.—McDonald's Bridge at Junction Road. Wm. McDonald received \$3,000 and Angus McDonald \$5,000 for repairs.

3rd.—Two bridges at McDonald's Mill, Bonwell, repaired, Patrick Woods was paid \$1.25 and Morris McCloskey \$5.00.

4th.—Bridge near Neil McDonald's, Rivendale. Repaired by Alexander McFadyen, \$3,000.

5th.—McDonald's at Bonshaw repaired, Jas. McMorrow was paid \$12,000.

6th.—McDonald's Bridge on Bear's Mill Road, near Hampton. Repaired by Neil Ferguson, \$1,500.

There are also three Ferguson Stewart Bridges and two McFarlane Bridges and they all appear in the Public Works' report under the name of Palmer's, McKinnon's, Stewart's and McFarlane's, respectively. For instance, there is Stewart's Bridge at Stanchel, rebuilt by D. Lamont, for \$35,000, and Stewart's Bridge at Argyle Shore, by Arch. McPhail for \$12,000. The expenditure upon these has been actually and honestly made, and anyone doubting the truth of this statement can be furnished with the names and addresses of the various parties who did the work on the respective bridges, and received the amounts set opposite their names, by inquiring of the undersigned.

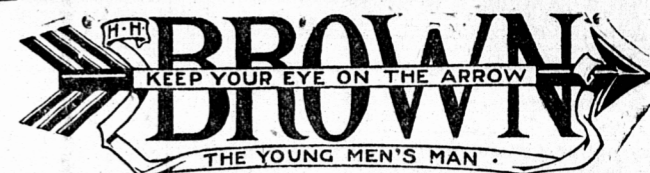

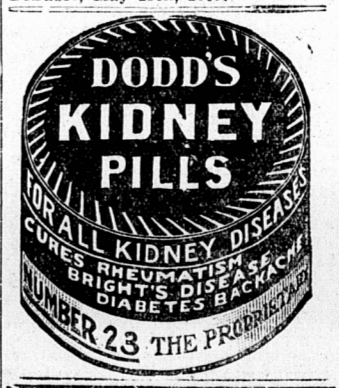
