### BUDDHISTS SEND PEACE MESSAGE

TOKIO, Oct. 8, (Special)—Buddhists, assembled in mass meeting in the Hongwanji Temple, adopted a resolution in the form of a message to President Woodrow Wilson bearing on the relations of Japan and the United States. The message, which was forwarded to the President, was as follows:—

"For the sake of universal peace and the progress of humanity, which are the ideals of Buddhism, we, in paying homage to the President, earnestly wish for the development of a friendship between Japan and the United States based on liberty and justice, with the exclusion of religious and racial prejudices."

Three thousand Buddhists were present. Mr. Oishi, leader of the progressive party, declared that only by war could Japan obtain a fundamental solution of the California land question. He urged determination on the part of the nation to back up the authorities.

The Jiji Shimpo says that negotiations are shortly to be reopened with the United States in the matter of the California alien land act.

"Japan," says the newspaper, "desiring to reach a fundamental solution of the California question and finding the acquisition of naturalization for Japanese in California most difficult, is about to propose a new treaty with the United States. Former negotiations which have been de-occupied with the Mexican trouble and the tariff bill, will be begun at an early date."

### AMHERST'S NEW CATHOLIC PASTOR

WINDSOR, N. S., Oct. 6—Rev. Father Brown left this morning for Amherst to take up his new pastorate. Yesterday he farewelled here and his congregation deeply regret his removal, for he has been faithful and energetic in his work. The beautiful church and glebe house commenced under Rev. Father Kennedy has been completed by Rev. Father Brown, and at Sunday morning's service four altar boys and six little girls dressed in white with white veils each carried burning tapers which they applied to the receptacle holding the mortgage. The congregation presented their beloved pastor with \$140 in gold, accompanied by an address. Rev. Father Collins will be his successor.

### CONFERENCE AT AMHERST.

AMHERST, Oct. 6.—This week Amherst opens her doors to the delegates to the great missionary convention of the Canadian Methodist church. This important gathering has brought to our town not only representative leaders of religious thought, but also many men who have attained prominence in other professions as well as in the field of commerce and in the sphere of instructive enterprise.

It is sixteen years since the central board of missions met in eastern Canada and for the first time in its history it convenes in the town of Amherst. The board proper is composed of about forty men, representing every province in Canada, from the Atlantic to the Pacific. This mission board deals with all the varied problems of home and foreign mission enterprise in connection with the Methodist church in Canada and last year its budget totalled an expenditure of \$650,000.

The calls from our own Canadian west where the churches of Canada are grappling with the problem of assimilating a foreign population from China, Japan and other places, are so urgent that this year the mission board is aiming to raise one million dollars.

### NEW TYPE OF OIL BURNING CRAFT

NEW YORK, Oct. 8, (Special)—The German oil burning vessel Wotan, declared by her owners to be the largest screw motor tank vessel in the world, completed her maiden voyage Saturday when she was made fast to the Standard Oil Pier in Bayonne, N. J., where she will take on a cargo of oil for Germany. The type of engine used by the Wotan was the invention of Dr. Rudolph Diesel, who was recently reported lost at sea.

The arrival of the Wotan marks the addition of a new type of craft to the trans-Atlantic cargo-carrying traffic. She was completed in Hamburg thirty days ago and starting from the German city eighteen days ago. She developed 2,500 horsepower, marking an unbroken voyage at 8 1/2 knots an hour. The engines of the vessel never were stopped during the trans-Atlantic trip, save when she picked up the pilot, her master reported. The Wotan carries no boilers, being propelled by the internal combustion of oil burned in the cylinders.
