BROCKVILLE GOES CONSERVATIVE.

The constituency of Brockville was represented in the Ontario Legislature by Mr. Graham, leader of the Ontario Opposition in that body. When he was chosen as Minister of Railways in the Ottawa Government and went back to his constituents he was returned, some weeks ago by acclamation. His resignation from the Legislature left the Brockville seat at that body vacant and an election was held which was contested, the candidates being Lewis Liberal and Donavon, Conservative. The latter was elected by about 250 majority, where at the general election Mr. Graham, Liberal, had 109 majority.

In explanation of the Liberal defeat and loss of a seat it is pointed out that a Liberal Government was in power in Ontario when Mr. Graham was elected some years ago, and also that he was personally very popular. Now a Conservative Government holds the seals of office in the big Province. It seems to be a good year for Governments. Sir Wilfrid Laurier has gained a seat in Saint John and Premier Whitney has gained a seat in Brockville. These changes give zest to the coming bye-elections for the Commons in London, and two other seats in Ontario. These may give a further clew to the real trend of political sentiment in that Province.

THE NATIONS FOR PEACE.

At the Hague Conference the question of obligatory arbitration before war has been decided in the affirmative by a vote of the nations represented, thirty-one to nine. This does not mean that in no case shall war be permitted without first referring the trouble to arbitration, or that in all cases the decision of the arbitrators shall be final and binding upon the parties. It simply means that a large proportion of the causes of war shall be submitted to an impartial board before hostilities are entered upon.

The chief promoters of the arbitration movement were Britain and the United States. The opponents of the measure were Germany, Austria-Hungary, Switzerland, Belgium, Roumania, Greece, Turkey, Bulgaria and Montenegro. Three powers refrained from voting. These were Japan, Italy and Luxemburg. It would seem that only the powers who voted for the compulsory arbitration clause are bound by the decision, but as there are thirty-one of these, the measure will have a very wide effect. Britain, the United States, Russia, Holland, Sweden, Norway, Spain, Portugal and the South American Republics are included among the signatory powers.

It is claimed on behalf of the Whitney Government that it has effected a great saving in the price of school books. In the term of school readers the saving is published to be from 20 to 75 per cent.

The subject of the cost of school books is likely to become a live one in other Provinces as well as Ontario.

There will be a record Local Option campaign this fall in Ontario, the object being to prevent the issue of liquor licenses and so delectualize the traffic in the municipalities where the local option by-laws are adopted. There are already 153 municipalities in the Province in which the traffic is thus placed under ban. There are 79 more in which the temperance people are conducting energetic campaigns, 35 of which are incorporated towns or villages.

A countryman who recently procured a liquor certificate from a well-known doctor, informs the Guardian that the doctor did not ask him whether he was ill or not, or whether any of his family were in need of medicine. "I simply told him that I wanted a bottle to take home," our informant says, "and he gave me a certificate." It seems a pity that honest, self-respecting physicians should be scandalized in this fashion by subaction of their professional brethren. Has the Medical Society no power to purge its membership rolls of such men?

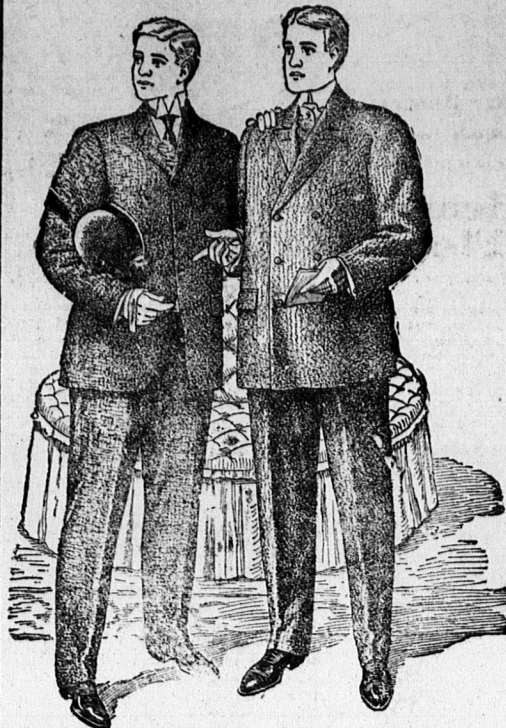
