**Dundee Will Not Quit The Ring**

NEW YORK, Nov. 1.—Despite the urgent request of his friends that he retire from the ring, following his defeat at the hands of Tony Canzoneri, Johnny Dundee, the Italian featherweight with the Scotch fighting name, has decided to continue his activities.

"From now on, boxing centres are going to see as much, if not more of Johnny Dundee than they did from 1921 to 1924," is the announcement of the veteran, issued today.

"I have given the best that I had every time I fought," Johnny said. "When I am convinced I no longer can stand up among the top-notchers in my class, then I will be the first to notify the press and the public that I have forsaken the ring forever."

Dundee, objecting to the criticism of the press regarding his comeback in the ring after a year's absence, declared that he lasted fifteen rounds against the fast, hard-hitting and aggressive Canzoneri, and added that he did not think any one would beat Canzoneri.

**Sayers Is Stopped In First Round**

PHILADELPHIA, Nov. 1.—George Godfrey, bulky negro battler of Pennsylvania, knocked out Tom Sayers, of Detroit, in the first round of a scheduled 10-round bout at the Arena tonight. Godfrey weighed 237; Sayers 200.

A terrific left hook to the jaw sent Sayers down for the count two minutes after the match started. Godfrey battered the Detroit boxer about the body from the opening gong and had him hanging on the ropes when the finishing punch was delivered. Sayers failed to land a blow on the negro.

Sayers was Godfrey's seventh straight victim via the knockout route. Sayers recently outpointed Roy Mitchell at Boston.

Sayers' share of the purse was held up by Chairman Frank Weiner, but many spectators said it appeared to them that the Detroit fighter had not been trying, and "laid down" by the boxing board when Godfrey hit him.
