
Rev. Wm. Harrison, City, lectured before the Theological Union of Mt. Allison in Sackville Tuesday Morning. His subject was "Unconscious Orthodoxy." The principal purpose of the lecture was to show from a comprehensive study of comparative religions that what has been clearly revealed in the Christian system, so far as the fundamentals are concerned, was more or less dimly anticipated by many of the pagan religions of antiquity. Religion is a phenomenon of all races and the convictions respecting God, sin, atonement by sacrifice, and the need and expectation of some form of incarnation and the feeling as to a life beyond have marked many of the great systems which have reared their immense fabrics in the history of the past and have played a most powerful part in the shaping of the hopes and lives of vast multitudes from one age to another. The second part of the lecture dealt with what might be called the Orthodox positions assumed and taught with an absolute certainty by agnostic, rationalistic and thoroughly sceptical writers regarding our inability when left to ourselves to affirm anything respecting the Great First Cause.

A Prince Edward Island young man of some note in athletic circles passed death by a very narrow margin in Sackville last week when he was dragged at the steps and a moving train and then flung to the ground. The Sackville Tribune says: The young man was travelling on a west bound train for Point du Come to take the steamer. At the station here he came from the car to its platform and then down to the ground. He stood holding to the hand rail at the car step when the train began to move. Whatever the reason, he did not seem in condition to take care of himself and bystanders soon saw that his position was one of peril. For a moment it seemed that he must be drawn beneath the wheels but fortunately for him the man was thrown off to one side as the train picked up speed. He was bruised about the head quite severely and shaken up. He was taken into the station. Later on he left the station to walk up town. Not long after this he again put in appearance, sweater in hand, without his boots and with his clothing otherwise disarranged. He ran down the track. A couple of men seeing him followed him and though he outdistanced them for a time it was not long before he was caught and brought back to the station. As much was done as possible to put him in condition to travel, though what was done was not very successful, and he was sent on toward Point du Come on another train. The last reports were that he was seen at Painsec Junction still more or less incapacitated.
