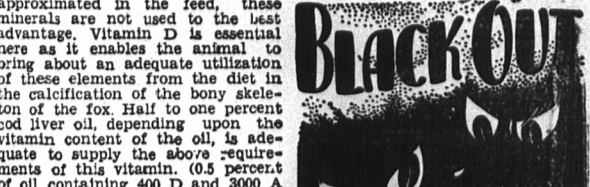

approximated in the feed, these minerals are not used to the best advantage. Vitamin D is essential here as it enables the animal to bring about an adequate utilization of these elements from the diet in the calcification of the bony skeleton of the fox. Half to one percent cod liver oil depending upon the vitamin content of the oil, is adequate to supply the above requirements of this vitamin. (0.5 percent of oil containing 400 D and 3000 A units per gram). Fox pups, which become weak in the hind legs as a result of feed deficiencies or other causes, sometimes drag their hind quarters around the pen floors giving rise to sores which may become infected. This infection sometimes spreads to cause genito-urinary infections in severe cases.



The fate of the entire pup crop depends upon what happens inside the kennel. For three more weeks the Kennel management is almost entirely up to the mother!

When fish is stored to be used as feed it should be washed free of all slime before being placed in a refrigerator, for it has been found the fish harbors bacteria which greatly accelerate the decomposition of stored fish. Fish should be washed and placed under refrigeration immediately after they are caught, for they contain varying amounts of fats which make them relatively difficult to keep. They become potential sources of danger to fox pups if they have been thawed and are fed to foxes. Under such conditions the bacteria on the surface and others in the intestine generally increase in number and start the processes of putrefaction.

When canned fish or chicken are used in fox feeds, the cans should be carefully inspected for leaks and being first. Usually the contents of such cans are potentially dangerous sources of food poisoning and should not be used as feed for animals.

Cereal feeds, manufactured from "ropy" flour or fungus infected meals, have been suspected of causing sickness and deaths among fox pups. Such infected materials may be made up into biscuits which appear to be in very good condition, and these biscuits may readily be overlooked when studying a fox ration. Bacteria of the cause of trouble in a ranch. Bacterial examination of such feeds usually shows the presence of spore-forming organisms which survive the cooking of the biscuit, as is the case with Bacillus mesentericus, the causal agent of "ropy" flour. The addition of acid in the baking removes this source of danger in bread and other baked goods.

When autopsies are performed on dead fox pups in a certain percentage of cases the cause of death is due to the ingestion of sharp bones, slivers of wood, straw, hay or other foreign bodies. Rickets can readily be avoided in growing fox pups if the feed is mixed with milk, or if two percent ground bone is added to the ration in conjunction with some source of vitamin D such as cod liver oil.
