SHOULD USE SILVER

Cook's Corner

POTATO MUFFINS

4 tablespoons shortening

2 tablespoons sugar

1/2 teaspoon salt

1 egg

1 cup mashed potato (all lumps out)

2 cups sifted flour

3 teaspoons baking powder

1 cup milk

Cream shortening and sugar, add beaten egg, then potato. Beat well. Sift flour, baking powder and salt. Add milk and flour alternately. Bake in greased muffin tins 375 degrees F.

DREAM TARTS

Made medium-size, for pastry delectable for party cake-plate

1/2 cup sifted flour

1/2 teaspoon baking powder

1/2 teaspoon salt

4 tablespoons butter

1/2 cup granulated sugar

1 egg, well beaten

1/2 teaspoon grated orange rind

3 tablespoons strained orange juice

Raspberry jam

8 average-sized unbaked tart shells.

Measure and sift together twice the flour, baking powder and salt. Cream butter and gradually blend in sugar; cream well together. Add beaten egg, a little at a time, beating well after each addition; stir in orange rind.

Add the dry ingredients to creamed mixture alternately with orange juice, combining lightly after each addition.

Place a spoonful of jam in bottom of each tart shell, fill with batter.

Bake in a hot oven, 425 degrees, about 15 minutes. Yield—8 tarts.

That Body Of Yours

7,500,000 ARTHRITICS IN U.S.

It must be encouraging to the many thousands of sufferers with rheumatism to see the great interest being taken all over the world in rheumatism and arthritis. The various countries are organizing to learn more of the cause or causes of rheumatism and to give relief to sufferers from this crippling affliction.

In the United States, a recently formed organization is the Arthritis and Rheumatism Foundation, announced by Dr. Paul Holbrook, Tucson, Ariz., in the "Journal of the American Medical Association." The new foundation is sponsored by the American Rheumatism Association, Research Foundation, the Detroit Fund for Crippling Diseases and other organizations. Seven and one-half million persons in the U.S. are estimated to be afflicted with arthritis and related disorders.

The Arthritis and Rheumatism Foundation will have businessmen of proved ability directing its financial arrangements, while medical men and research workers make up the active part of the organization. It has five objects in view, among which are the following:

1. Develop, with the aid of the National Research Council, a research program to mobilize facilities of the nation's medical schools and scientific laboratories in the search to discover the causes and methods for the prevention and cure of rheumatic diseases.

2. Establish fellowship designed to increase the number of men qualified to conduct research and specialize in the treatment of rheumatic diseases.

3. Foster the development of more adequate provisions in general hospitals for patients with rheumatism.

The crippling of arthritis ruins many useful lives, besides causing pain. It is encouraging to learn that a national organization of such standing will do for these sufferers what is being done for victims of cancer, infantile paralysis and heart disease.

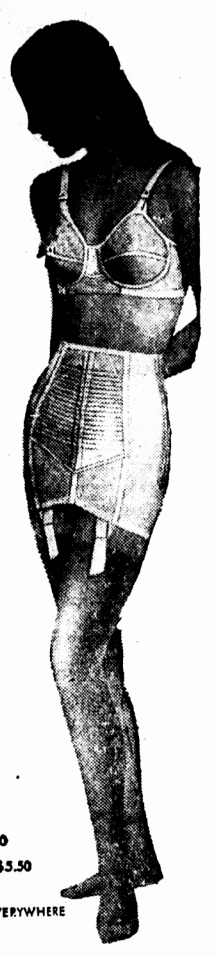
