statement of Sir Edward Kemp created much interest. Opposition papers from one coast of Canada to the other have made attempts at all sorts of political capital out of the disclosures said to have been contained in the report from Colonel Jenkins to Sir Edward Kemp, and which it is alleged Sir Edward Kemp suppressed. Sir Edward Kemp's plain statement that he never received such a report took much wind out of the critics' sails.

The report here today is that the Government may after all drop good roads proposal, as the result of criticism of its provisions emanating from the larger provinces as to the amounts of money to be given the smaller provinces. One ground of complaint is that the Maritime Provinces with a small mileage of roads to be kept up get the same initial payments as larger provinces, and it is on this account that representatives of the larger provinces are kicking. There is, of course, the prospect that when it is brought down it may be amended to meet these criticisms, but it is more likely the bill will be laid over altogether for the present year at least.

There is no sign of the budget yet, and probably not for two weeks.
