



FEDERAL PRISON AT ATLANTA GA.

On his arrival at the federal prison, which is just outside Atlanta, Mr. Morse was delivered to the warden and shaved, bathed and measured for a suit. No special privileges will be accorded him. He is fifty-five years old. Three years commutation for good behavior will be allowed, so that if he serves his complete sentence he will be sixty-seven years old when released.

As a place of involuntary residence the Atlanta prison has many advantages over ordinary institutions of confinement. Prisoners wear plain suits instead of stripes, they are allowed to smoke in their cells and if they wish it receive a weekly allowance of chewing tobacco. There are also frequent concerts and lectures and prisoners have access to a library of seven thousand volumes. Talking is permitted within reasonable restrictions and prisoners may see one visitor a week.

The prison contains about two hundred negroes and a dozen or more Indians, most of whom are serving sentences for murder. The building is a park of 321 acres, of which a great part is laid out in farm land, cultivated by prisoners.

Among the men in the cells now are Benjamin D. Greene and John F. Gaynor who with Captain Oberlin Carter, were convicted of frauds in connection with government work at the harbor of Savannah. Green and Gaynor have each about a year more to serve.

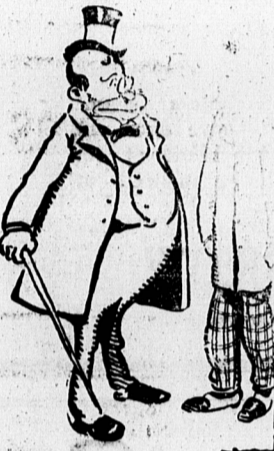

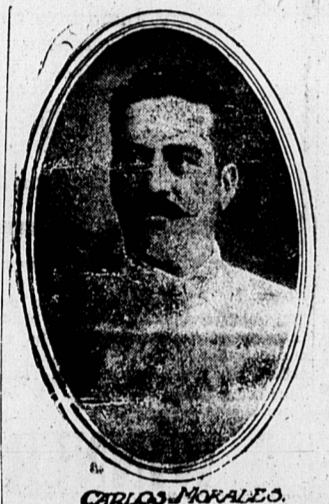
