Plant Line's new Steamer

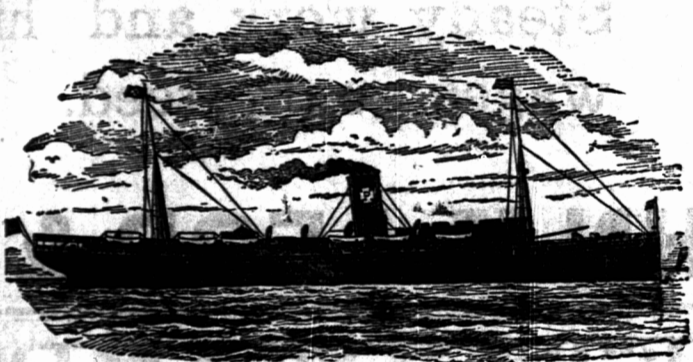
For this Route.

A MAGNIFICENT SHIP

Built of Steel and Admitted

To Be "Queen of the Fleet."

The launch of the new Plant steamship at Newport News, Va., was a triumph for the Plant system, which has been brought to the perfection demanding the services of such a magnificent vessel through the exertions of Mr. G. B. Plant, the President, who has lived in health to enjoy this splendid result of his labor. That the new vessel, the queen of the Plant fleet, certainly will be worthy of her proud position goes without saying, for nothing has been left undone that could suggest itself to the wisdom of the most experienced shipbuilders and naval architects to perfect her.



This vessel is built entirely of steel, of the following dimensions: 404 feet long over all, 380 feet between perpendiculars, 47 feet 9 inches beam, 37 feet 4 inches deep from the top of the deck to base line, and will be fitted with two steel masts, fore-and-aft rigged. She has a water bottom extending from her stuffing box bulkhead to her collision bulkhead, also nine steel decks; all the houses are of steel. The stern and ladder frames are made of cast steel, and the rudder stock of the best fluid compressed steel, manufactured by the Bethlehem Iron Works, while the steering gear consists of a steam apparatus operated by the telemotor; also heave ho Nipper steering gear. The vessel is fitted with a Providence windlass and capstan and Williamson Bros. hoisting engines for handling cargo, and in addition thereto has steam elevators in two hatches.

Of the main deck forward is the dining saloon, with a seating capacity for 125 people. This room is handsomely fitted up and decorated in white and gold. Forward of the dining-room is a reception room forward of which are sleeping accommodations for passengers. In the after end of the dining saloon is a grand stairway leading to the social hall above.

On the main deck aft of the dining saloon is the pantry, and aft of this a large galley. On this deck will be located cold storage for provisions, officers' mess room, baker and porter shop, telephone exchange room, stewardess' room and a number of staterooms abreast of the boiler and engine hatches for oilers, water tenders, etc. Aft of the machinery is the main saloon with two tiers of staterooms on each side; in the forward end of this saloon is a grand stairway leading to the social hall above. Immediately aft of the main saloon are toilet bathrooms, etc., for ladies and gentlemen.

In the forward end of the upper or promenade deck is a social hall for second-class passengers, aft of which is a social hall for first-class passengers with a stairway leading to the dining-room. This social hall has quite a number of staterooms for first-class passengers.

On the pilot-house deck forward is the pilot house, aft of which are two captain's rooms and two tiers of staterooms continuing to the smoke stack. Over the social hall aft is a large steel house fitted up as a ladies' observatory. The second-class social hall and reception is finished in quartered oak.

The staterooms are superbly fitted being large and airy. Telephones in each room connected with the Steward's and Piroas office and some rooms have bath-rooms adjoining.

The vessel is equipped with twelve lifeboats, six life-rafts and the necessary life-preservers, etc., and in fact, everything necessary for the safety of passen-

traveler. Another steamer is now being built by Mr. Plant at Cramp's and will join the fleet this year. The fittings and equipments of all these steamers make them second to none afloat. Mr. W. W. Clarke is agent at Charlottetown for this magnificent steamer.

HALIEX MARKETS.

Belle—Ordinarily you appear real womanly, Edith, but sometimes rather masculine. How do you account for it? Edith—I suppose it is hereditary. Half of my ancestors were males, and the other half females.

BUTTER—It looks as if we were going to have low priced butter at the first of the season. Already there has been a drop of considerable importance. Creamery tubs are now sold here at 18 1/2 to 19c.; Prints at 20c. Dairy tubs from western Ontario sell here at 12c. In the upper provinces there is a large make going on and prices range somewhat lower than they do here. Creamery was sold there last week for 16 1/2 to 16 3/4, and somewhat lower on English account. The prospects for a good trade with the old country are good this year, though at present the market is quiet, owing to a more than average amount of domestic product seeking sale. But the import demand is setting in early there this year and will likely be very large.

CHEESE—New cheese are selling here at 10c. to 11c. All the old cheese are out of the market and there is not a pound to be had. The Trade Bulletin reports that a number of factorymen in Ontario have been pretty actively engaged on the new make of cheese since the first of the month, and from advices received from those sections it seems that the make will be larger than expected, sales having been made of todays to arrive off the other side, first half of May at 48s to 49s 6d.

In Quebec a number of factories changed their make from butter to cheese so that the May make is expected to be of at least a good average one. Factorymen are not expected to commence making full grass cheese before the middle of the month, if then. In England there appears to be enough of the old cheese left for all purposes for a time yet and for the present buyers are only taking supplies as they need them.

Eggs—There has been no change in the egg market of late, though since last issue the price has dropped to 11c. Business is dull. The shipment of eggs to the old country has commenced. It is rather early for this business, but already several large cargoes have gone.

POULTRY, PORK, ETC.—The price quoted by leading dealers on turkeys is 3 cents lower than our last, being now 17 cents. Fowls are still selling at the old price of 10 cents but are rather scarce. Spring chickens are sold at \$1 per pair. Since navigation has opened up and Island ports are once more easily accessible, lamb is considerably cheaper and is sold at \$4 a carcass. Pork also is cheaper at 5 to 6c.

The machinery consists of two inverted, direct setting service condensing, quadruple expansion engines, driving twin screws; a hull being of manganese bronze. The total horse power of the engines are 7,000 supplied by eight boilers built for a working pressure of 250 pounds of steam, fitted with one smoke stack. In addition there are numerous Blake pumps for ballast, bilge, sanitary, fire, and feed purposes. Unusual precautions have been used in every part in the construction of this vessel for the safety and comfort of passengers, having accommodations for about 500 first-class and 200 second class. This vessel was also designed in compliance with U. S. Government requirements for auxiliary cruisers.

Since the Mascotte was built in 1885 the Plant line has steadily extended its service. From the system about the Florida coast, and between Port Tampa Cuba and Jamaica, catering so magnificently in hotels and steam communications to winter tourists, and travelers, the line a few years ago extended its service eastward and absorbed the Canada-Atlantic Steamship Company, with its fine ocean steamer Halifax, plying between Boston and Halifax, and also the Old Colonial line, between Boston, Halifax, the Strait of Canso and Charlottetown, with their steamers Carroll and Worcester, which were retired and broken up, the service being improved in summer by the Olivette or Florida, the latter also another large addition to the line. This Eastern business has developed very extensively, with demands by summer tourists often exceeding accommodations, so that between Florida and Nova Scotia, and P. E. Island the Plant System has become far-famed for leading to every thing desirable by the
