FROM ABROAD.—That the fame of the Prince Edward Island fox industry is spreading abroad over the world is evidenced by the fact that a gentleman in Montague received the other day, a draft for \$3000 from a friend in the Sandwich Islands with instructions to invest the amount in several fox companies. The Montague gentleman had written to his friend from abroad about a year ago telling him, among other things, of the development of the fox business. The latter evidently investigated the matter thoroughly, was satisfied with the result and, after the lapse of a year decided to invest his money in the business.

THE BISLEY TEAM.—The question is still in doubt whether Prince Edward Island will this year have a representative on the Canadian team for Bisley. As is doubtless already known, a Prince Edward Islander, the person of Percy W. Landrigan, of Charlottetown, at the last Dominion meeting earned his right to a place on the team. At the time Landrigan shot at this meeting he was a member of the Cadet Corps, being still below the age limit for the Militia. This is where the trouble arose. Under the rules of the Dominion Rifle Association, no cadet can be a member of the team for Bisley. It is a curious fact that on the second day of the meeting, Landrigan attained the age which qualified him for admission to the Militia. It is argued by those who object to his inclusion on the Bisley team that if that is done he cannot be a cadet. The fact remains, that whether or not Landrigan is allowed his place on the Bisley team, he is entitled to the cadet prizes which he won and won fairly, as at the time of his entry and up to the second day of the meeting he fulfilled all the qualifications for cadets. The fact also remains, that cadet or not, he has won his place on the team for Bisley, and it seems a ridiculous rule that should prevent a man from enjoying those privileges which he has fully and fairly won, because of his age. If Landrigan was good enough to shoot his way into the front rank at the Dominion meet, what matter his age? Besides, the Cadet Corps is the proper stepping stone to the Militia, and to all intents and purposes is the recruiting ground for the Militia. The P. E. I. P. R. A. representatives on the Council of the Dominion Rifle Association, Col. Brewer and Hutchison, have been urged by the Council of the local Association to leave no stone unturned to get Landrigan his rights; and the matter is still under the consideration of the Dominion Rifle Council.

P. E. ISLAND HORSES.—The number of horses in P. E. Island is increasing but not nearly as rapidly as their value. The Census Returns give the number of horses in P. E. Island in 1901 as 33,731 valued at \$2,147,935.00, in 1911 as 35,935 valued at \$4,270,372.00. There were however in 1911 very few Pure Bred Mares in the province, now there are upwards of one hundred and there have since been some very fine stallions imported. The market too has been much improved, so that the value of horses today in P. E. Island is well on to five million dollars. The very choice of these will be at the Horse Show on the 25th and 26th of this month and every lover of horses should make it a point to be present.
