Immigration.

Most thoughtful people in Canada judging from the public expressions I have heard, feel that we have but one problem in Canada, namely, that of increasing the population and I think this is largely correct. If the Dominion is to develop as it should, and if we are to enjoy all of the advantages which follow in the train of development, we in Canada must address ourselves vigorously to the question of immigration.

In conclusion, I want to thank the Board of Trade of Montreal, for their kindness and hospitality in giving me an opportunity to meet so many representative citizens of the Dominion and to thank each of you who have patiently listened to what I am afraid must of necessity have been a somewhat rambling discourse.

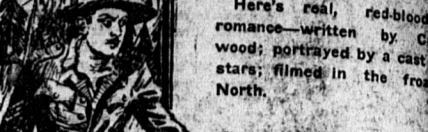
