When two thirds of the late century was passed in 1837 the Provinces of Canada were moved to unite themselves in one Dominion, and in the remaining third the work was consolidated and completed.

There is one greater union yet to be accomplished, which seems of more necessity and has been longer in the minds of men than the federation of the scattered Provinces under the Southern Cross or the North Star.

Yet in all this we see only such union as existed among the British North American Provinces before Confederation. They too had one Sovereign, flag and fleet and something of mutual interest in each other.

These conditions are abnormal and undesirable. The great Russian Empire is united in the form of a compact territory bound together by iron bands, and in all things, whether for offence, defence, or for any purpose of diplomacy, or development acts as an unit.

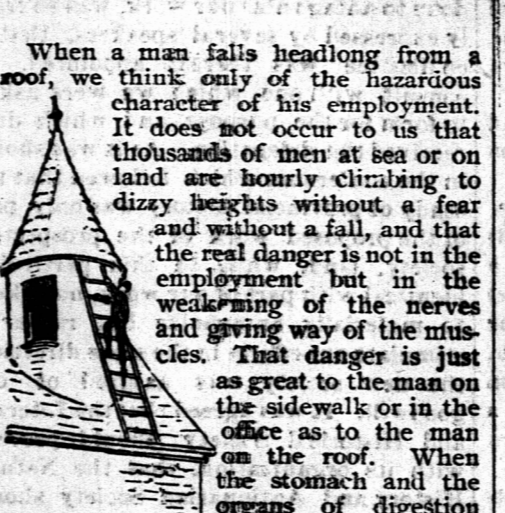

feeling of sympathy, coupled with an increased desire for a closer and more real union. That such a feeling exists is due to the liberty and justice which prevail under the British flag, and to the noble qualities of the Sovereign we have lost, who possessed marvellous and unprecedented power of centring the affections of all her subjects in herself.

Herein lies the great difficulty in the way of effecting imperial unity. We hope and believe that it will not be found to be an insoluble one. But no satisfactory scheme has yet been formulated. The distant parts of the Empire are gradually being brought together by cables, commerce, and mutual regard.
