Prices Decline On Montreal Exchange

MONTREAL, Oct. 23 (CP)—Prices declined fractions to 5 points in trading today on the stock exchange and curb market as trends copied those in New York. Papers, industries, utilities, banks and golds were pegged lower in the indices. Golds went to a new two-year low. Turnover was light. Easier in papers, were Price, Consolidated, Abitibi Common and Preferred, Eddy "A", International, Brown, M. and O., St. Lawrence Common, H. Smith and Fraser. Donnacona had a revival of the activity and strength it displayed several weeks ago. MacLaren and Bathurst "A" also were ahead. Bathurst "B" was up and St. Lawrence Paper Preferred off for a time. Weaker in industrials were National Steel Car, Massey Common, Ford, H. Bridge, Foundation, Prège and Vickers. In front were U. Steel, Cocksutt, D. Bridge, Marconi and Massey Preferred. Dominion Textile firmed in its section. In beverages, Seagrams and Walker improved. National Breweries ceded a lift. Alco "B" and Canadian Breweries retrieved losses and United Distillers. Alco "A" backed up. Commercial Alcohols was down. Bell Telephone and Montreal Power advanced in utilities and Braxillan, Powver Corporation, Shawinigan, I. Utilities and Quebec Power. In banks, in arrears were Commerce, Dominion, Montreal and Royal. Provincial Transport was higher in carriers and C.P.R. Milling issues were on the low side. Ogilvie, after opening for a gain, fell back in company with Maple Leaf Milling, Purity and Lake of the Woods. Noranda and Alcoa Preferred did better in metals but in loss terrain were Aluminum, Smelters and Nickel. H. B. Mining wiped out a deficit. Imperial, B. A. and McColl slipped in oil refineries. Hollinger posted a decrease in golds. In junior mining, were Sullivan, Sherritt and Joliet and off were East Malartic, Akaticho, Lingman, MacDonald, Buffadison, Nechi and Central Cadillac. In miscellaneous, Southern converted a loss into a gain and also harder were Argus, Wills, Lewis and Legare Preferred. Softer were Lindsay, top loser, Lumber and Pamous Players. Trading box notes: Total sales: 162,800 shares; mines, 115,500; industrials, 27,300; stocks lower 64; higher 35; unchanged 47; new high 1; new lows 5.

Demand For Liquor Sugar Issues Act As Market Brake

NEW YORK, Oct. 23 (AP)—Last minute demand for liquor and sugar issues braked a declining stock market today. Announcement of OPA decontrol of all foods except sugar and rice was soon followed by expanded interest in liquor and sugar issues. Scheinley gained 3 at 63 1-2, National Distillers 1 1-4 at 23 3-4, Cuban-American Sugar 2 at 22 1-2, Fajardo Sugar 7-8 at 23 1-2, and Francisco Sugar 2 at 27. The Associated Press 60-stock average dipped .04 of one point to 62 1-2. Canadian issues were irregular. Recovering from the noon slump were Hiram Walker (new) and Distillers Seagram, each up 3-4. McIntyre and Dome Mines each slipped 1-4 and Canadian Pacific 3-8. On the Curb, Lake Shore gained 1-8. In the minus column were U. S. Steel at 70, Youngstown Sheet at 63 3-4, U. S. Rubber at 37, Montgomery Ward at 67 3-4, Anaconda at 37 1-4, and American Telephone at 172 7-8. Also lower were Sears Roebuck, American Woolen Common and Preferred, Santa Fe, Phelps Dodge, Westinghouse, International Harvester and John-Manville. Douglas Aircraft moved up nearly 3 to 80, Bethlehem was fractionally ahead at 85, and Union Carbide up about as much at 84 3-4. Others higher included American Smelter, Distillers Corp., Texas Co. and Engineers Public Service.

Grapes Provide Many Dainties

In the good old days, grapes and grape juice were prescribed by medical authorities as a cure for various diseases. And until not too long ago the "grape cure" was recommended for digestive disorders. But whether you look on them as medicine or not, grapes are just about as plentiful as apples this year and the two may be combined to make several delightful winter desserts. The recipe: four medium apples, one cup of grape juice. Peel core and slice apples in half-inch slices and cook in grape juice until tender (about eight minutes). Chill. The amount serves six persons. If those grapes were bought this year with an eye to making jelly—here are a few general directions which might be handy not only now but later on, if you wish to paste them in your favorite cookbook. 1. Pick grapes over carefully selecting firm ones, removing and discarding stems and stalks, then wash grapes under gentle stream of water, and drain. 2. Don't add water unless grapes have gone through a particularly dry season. (This year's crop is moist enough.) 3. Cook slowly until fruit is soft and mushy and juice is drawn out. 4. Drain through a moist jelly bag. If bag is not squeezed the jelly will be clearer, but squeezing the pulp increases the quantity of jelly and gives a pronounced flavour. 5. Measure juice. For each cup of juice, three-quarters of a cup of sugar will be needed. 6. Boil juice gently for three minutes. 7. Add heated sugar. Boil three to ten minutes, or until jelly sheets from the spoon. 8. Remove scum. Pour into hot sterilized glasses. Let stand until set. Seal and cover.
