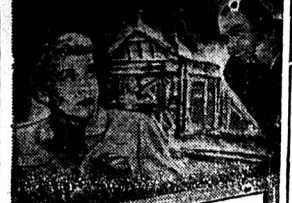

LOOKING OVER TENNIS COURTS — During the past week an interested group has been looking over the tennis court to estimate the amount of top soil that would be required to level off the whole court with from three to four inches of good soil. At present there is only the red clay which although serviceable, is nevertheless not as good as the layer of top soil. It was estimated that about seventy-five yards would be needed to do a good job, and provide sufficient base for working. The clubs expect to reorganize in the near future and plans are being made whereby the club will promote its interests to the best. Last year the club had a large membership, and this year it is expected that a larger number will enroll, and with this increased membership, the tennis courts with other centres which are also interested in tennis. Along with reopening the tennis, the club will also reopen the adjacent volleyball court for the members, and plans are also being laid to begin preparing for a club house which will be erected in the future. Should these proposed plans go through, it looks like a big year for the tennis club.

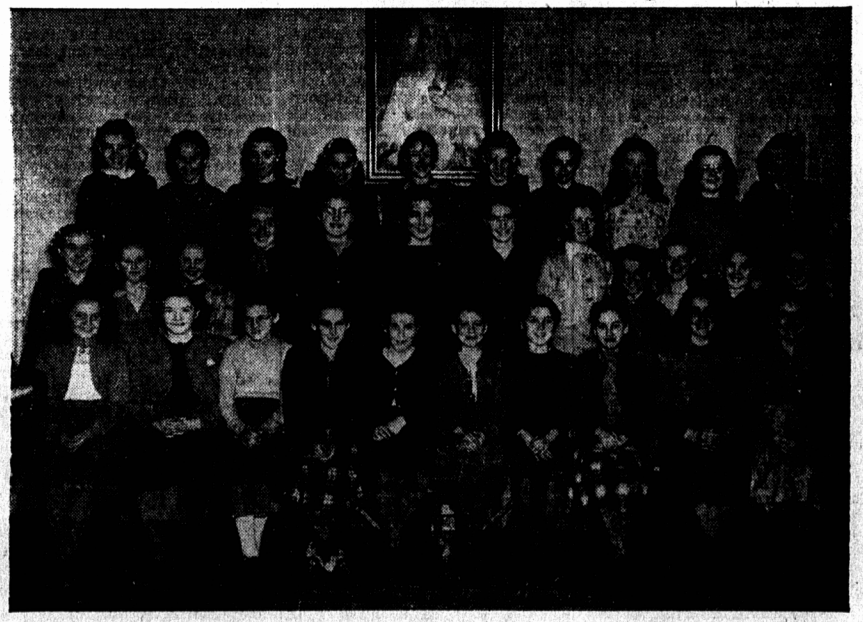

WALLACE BEERY, WITH DAUGHTER CAROL ANN, AT AGE OF 9 Grizzled Wallace Beery, who recently celebrated his 34th year as the "lovable oldascal" in Hollywood's rough and tumble movies, died at his home of a heart attack. He was 66. It was the last of many seizures suffered by the lusty character actor since he strained his heart last summer cranking an outboard motor. As a young man he was a chorus boy and a railroad wiper in a roundhouse. As the gray-haired, hard-boiled movie actor he made more than 250 pictures and kept the nation alternately chuckling and weeping for almost four decades. Only Lionel Barrymore boasted a longer Hollywood career. The actor was married twice. His first wife was Gloria Swanson. They were divorced in 1918. His second wife was Rita Gilman. They adopted Carol Ann, daughter of her cousin. Divorce ended this marriage in 1930.
