THIRD PARTIES.

Under representative institutions in English-speaking countries the tendency is to form two great parties and to discourage the growth of third parties. In continental Europe, notably in France and Germany, it is otherwise. In the British Parliament the Irish Nationalists, quite a numerous body, frequently maintain an attitude of comparative independence between the two greater political organisations.

These facts are worthy of consideration in view of the movement, which is apparently contemplated in Ontario, to form a third party devoted to prohibition of the liquor traffic. It is now almost half a century since prohibition first came before the Legislatures of New Brunswick and Nova Scotia for enactment into law.

THE MARKETS.

There was a fair attendance at the market yesterday, and prices varied but slightly from Friday's market.

Poultry was plentiful and advanced in prices. Geese sold from 10 to 10 1/2 cts per lb. turkeys, 14c and chickens 7 to 8c.

Eggs brought 24, 25c per doz and butter 22, 24c per lb.

The price of pork remains about the same from 4 1/2 to 5c.

The price of hay is unchanged, selling at 70 to 75c per cwt, pressed \$14.00. There was a slight tendency downwards in oats which hold, from 39 to 42.

Potatoes keep about the same at 20c per bus. and turnips 12 to 14c.
