### PROGRESS OF THE WAR.

From the first the war between Russia and Japan has been a series of surprises both on sea and land. This makes it the more difficult to forecast the events of the near future. Some military experts now predict that the first land engagement, for which all the world has become impatient, may not take place until well on in June. This arises from the fact that Russia has shown no desire to make a fight for any part of the territory of Korea. At first we were told there would be a fight at Seoul when the Japanese forces reached that point. When Seoul was peacefully occupied by the Japanese the probable scene of the first

great battle was fixed at Ping Yang, in northern Korea. The Japanese forces passed that point also on their northward march unopposed.

Then the world was assured that there would be a battle at Wiju, on the south side of the Yalu River, which city the Russians were fortifying, but Wiju has since been occupied by the Japanese without serious fighting. In fact almost the whole of Korea has been occupied by the Japanese forces without any really serious engagement. It has now become doubtful whether the passage of the Yalu River will be seriously opposed by the Russian forces. The site of the first great battlefield of the war is yet a subject of speculation. It may be on the Yalu River. It may be in the Liao Tung peninsula in the vicinity of New Chwang. It may be at some point in Manchuria between the mouth of the Yalu and New Chwang. But a decisive battle is not likely to be fought for weeks to come unless it be on the Yalu, owing to the rain, and the almost impassible condition of the roads

The rule of the road in British countries is that when one team meets another each shall turn to the left. It would greatly facilitate the progress of pedestrians on our crowded sidewalks if a similar rule were adopted and all going in one direction would keep to one side of the street, preferably following the highway rule, which is established by law. It is a matter of less consequence which way persons turn in passing on the sidewalks, provided that all turn the same way. In United States cities the rule is to turn to the right, following their rule in driving on the highway, which is the opposite of ours. In some Canadian cities the American rule of passing to the right on the sidewalks has come in. We think it better that the rule for the persons walking should be uniform with that for persons driving, as less liable to confusion. There is need for some definite rule for pedestrians in this matter, to obviate the dodging and jostling that are all too common.
