Wife Lucky If Not Fully Understood, But She Should Be Expert On Husband's Foibles

Wives are always complaining that their husbands do not understand them, which is God's mercy to them if they only realized it. For what would a poor woman do if her John was wise to all her little wiles and tactics and knew when she was crying for grief and when for revenue only; who knew that her "nerves" were a camouflage for temper and dinner of all of his favorite dishes that it was a prelude to telling him that Mother was coming for a nice long visit, or that she had fallen for a \$25 hat?

No indeed, the lucky wife is the one whose husband takes her at her face value and who doesn't try to delve into the mysteries of feminine psychology, but attributes all the things that puzzle him about her to the fact that she is a woman, and lets it go at that. Stupid is the woman who bemoans herself because her husband doesn't know the answer to the riddle she is. She should thank heaven on her knees that he has never guessed it.

But if husbands do not understand their wives, neither do wives understand their husbands, and if the one is a blessing, even if somewhat disguised, the other is an out-and-out misfortune. For much of the marital infelicity that wives never get really acquainted with their husbands, never find out what they do, or get the slightest inkling of how to work them.

Wife Should Understand Husband's Faults

I am not saying that a wife can pull off the miracle of changing her husband to her heart's desire, but I do say that she can make marriage a lot easier on herself and find his faults less hard to endure if she knows the inner workings of his mind.

I know, for instance, one sad-faced woman whose marriage has been a bitter disappointment to her, because she has never found out that her husband is an incurable tease and that when he jokes her about her new dress, or her clubs, or her bridge game, he is just trying to be funny and has no intention whatever of hurting her feelings.

On the contrary, he is perfectly devoted to her and considers her the most wonderful woman in the world, and his sense of humor, and his laughing with him or at him, she might have been happy with him instead of miserable all these years.

In all of marriage there is nothing that women so bitterly resent as the humiliation their husbands put upon them when they make them come to them like beggars for every cent on which to run the home and clothe themselves. Sometimes this is pure ingratitude and makes a wife hate her husband for his tight-fistedness. But often it is rooted in a man's love for his wife. He wants to play Providence to her and to have her look up to him as the source from which all blessings flow. And if she realizes this, it makes it easier for her to forgive him and ask for the money she has earned 10 times over by her labors.

They have a little cut-and-dried formula of the correct conduct for husbands and they try to force it on the men they marry. A husband must wife hate her husband for his tight-fistedness. She saw that he was starved for love and she gave it to him, or that he hungered for appreciation and flattery and she burned incense before him, or that he just wanted somebody to listen to him and she lent him her ears. And it did the trick.

Long ago a poet said that the proper study of mankind is man. This goes double for women. A course in husband study should be required for all wives.

HOME KNOWN BY COLORING

Color, when properly used, can endow some of the plainest homes with striking and pleasing individuality. Rows of just-alike houses can be made to appear refreshingly different when well-selected paints are used.

Dull spiritless houses frequently seem younger, more alive, and more enjoyable to live in when painted with gay colors. To show home owners what combinations of exterior hues go well together, the following "color recipes" have been taken from the "House of Outside Color" exhibition in New York City. They have been prepared by color experts for typical houses, located in all parts of the country.

Color recipe No. 1.—Forest green roof, pale coral walls, deep coral trim, red-orange door.
Color recipe No. 2.—Russet-colored r. of white walls, white trim, rust-colored shutters and front door.
Color recipe No. 3.—Brick-red roof, off-white walls and trim, Dutch blue door.
Color recipe No. 4.—Blue-gray roof, light yellow walls, daffodil yellow trim, deep gray front door.
Color recipe No. 5.—Roof blend of red and deep orange, yellow walls, orange shutters, and dark blue front door.

Sew through a square of blotting paper after you've oiled your machine to collect any surplus oil.

Try sulphur for ants—sprinkle the shelves with it and also treat the floor if they have been seen there.

Try using lemonade powder instead of sugar for a plain cake—it sweetens and flavors.

Stick small rubber stops at each corner of your tray to protect the surface of your polished table from scratches.

Run to the eucalyptus bottle for stains on delicate fabrics or for marks on your raincoat.

To pick up a color of the tweed for accessories. Worth uses a leather belt on his suit skirts, repeating the leather for accessories shown with the suit. Smooth suitings of the Saxony type, being taken up in increasing numbers, are a favorite with Worth of London.

One particularly lovely evening frock of turquoise jersey has a matching jacket beautifully embroidered with gold beads. Jackets will be nicely fitted to accent the current long torso silhouette.

THE COOK'S CORNER

RELISHES

RHUBARB RELISH

- 12 stalks rhubarb
- 1 bunch celery
- 4 large onions
- 4 cups brown sugar
- 1 sweet red pepper
- 2 cups vinegar
- 10 cloves
- 1 stick cinnamon
- 1 teaspoon mixed pickle
- 3 tablespoons salt

Chop rhubarb, celery, pepper and onions. Sprinkle with salt. Drain thoroughly. Add other ingredients. Cook slowly until thick. Pour into sterilized glasses. Seal while hot.

GOOSEBERRY RELISH

- 2 cups gooseberries
- 1-2 cup water
- 1-4 cup vinegar
- 1-4 cup sugar
- 1-2 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1-2 teaspoon cloves

Wash and remove stems and blossom end from gooseberries. Add other ingredients. Cook until thick. Pour into sterilized jars. Seal while hot.

SPICED RED CURRANTS

- 6 cups red currants
- 4 cups sugar
- 1 cup vinegar
- 1-2 teaspoon pickle spice
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1-2 teaspoon cloves
- 1 tablespoon chopped preserved ginger

Remove currants from stems before measuring. Make a syrup by boiling sugar, vinegar and spices 5 minutes. Cool strain. Add currants. Return to fire. Cook 15 minutes. Pour into sterilized jars. Seal while hot.

CANTALOUPE PICKLE

- Select firm, slightly under-ripe melons. Peel, quarter and remove seeds. Cut in one-inch cubes. Sprinkle with salt and let stand overnight. Drain. Measure. Use the following proportions:
- 3 cups dried melon
- 1 cup vinegar
- 1 tablespoon crushed ginger root
- 2 sticks cinnamon
- 1 teaspoon cloves
- 1 cup sugar

The spices in a bag. Cook 15 minutes. Remove spices. Cook 5 minutes. Pack in sterilized jars. Seal while hot.

SPICY FRUIT SAUCE

- 5 apples
- 5 peaches
- 5 plums
