IMPORTANT CATTLE SHIPMENT.—A big shipment of twenty two head of Holstein cattle from Watertown, N. Y., has reached this province. The pure blooded cattle, sons and daughters of the best of Jefferson county's registered stock, will join the herds of two well known Island black fox producers, and as a result of the transaction two prominent breeders in the Jefferson county Holstein-Friesian association will attempt in a small way the raising of foxes. One lot of cattle went to Mr. B. Graham Rogers, Summerside, while the other lot was consigned to Messrs W. K. Rogers, and Stanley Wedlock, Charlottetown. Seven head shipped were from the Roanoke farm of Dr. Delancy B. Armstrong at Pierpoint Manor sired by Sir Woodcrest Korndike Kattle de Kol VII, the 32-pound son of the former world champion four year old milk producer. Those selected by B. Graham Rogers will be used for exhibition purposes through the Dominion and Prince Edward Island this fall. Fifteen head were purchased from the north country farms of George N. Smith Watertown, N. Y., were a "choice lot. Most of the females were in calf to Champion Echo Ladoga, son of one of the famous world record twins and Champion Echo Sylvia Pontiac. This bull has his debut at the state fair in Syracuse and other important exhibitions this fall. This shipment which arrived last Saturday occupied two cars and consisted of four fine males and 17 females, none older than three years. They all were fed, tested and passed clean by Dr. Frank Lennis. The cattle have since been distributed. Some of them have been placed on the other farms of W. K. Rogers at Southport; some at Green wood Farm, Union the property of Mr. J. Stanley Wedlock, some at the Jas. C. Tuplin & Co. Farm at Black Banks, which are now owned by Messrs Rogers and Wedlock. The B. Graham Rogers' lot have been re-shipped to Summerside. There are five thoroughbred bulls in the lot—all from the most famous sires. Messrs Rogers and Wedlock selected these cattle during the trip of Mr. W. K. Rogers to northern New York last winter. They have been brought to the Island chiefly for the purpose of improving our Island stock.

Carmania's Trip An Eventful One

HALIFAX, August 9.—With practically every berth occupied, a total of nearly seventeen hundred passengers on board, the Cunard liner Carmania, Captain George W. Melsom, O.B.E., R.N.R., arrived in port at six o'clock on Saturday evening, landed three hundred and thirty-nine passengers and eighty-two bags of mail at Pier Two, and sailed at ten o'clock for New York, where she is due to arrive this morning.

The passage from Liverpool, via Queenstown, was a little longer than usual owing to the steamer meeting heavy swells during the greater part of her voyage across the Atlantic, which is rather unusual at this time of the year. It was the roughest weather she had encountered since last spring.

On board were Canada's Prime Minister and Mrs. Melghe, also a party of British school masters, while on the way across there was a birth, a suicide (that of a trimmer jumping into the sea), and an operation for appendicitis performed by the ship's surgeon.

Leaving Liverpool on July 30th, the Carmania called at Queens-

town, the next morning, and got away from that port at eight o'clock. She made the run from Daunt's Rock to Chebucto Head, steaming 2481 miles at an average speed of 15.69 knots, in six days and twelve hours. Strong and fresh winds, accompanied by a heavy swell, were encountered the greater part of the way.

When the Carmania docked on the north side of Pier Two, and the immigration, customs and railway officials handled the passengers and their baggage expeditiously, with the result that the ship was ready for sea again at ten o'clock three hours after docking. A special train with her Canadian passengers left shortly after midnight for Montreal.
