EUROPEAN NEWS

ODESSA, Oct. 16—(Special)—In a communication to the "Nepos Vremya", a naval reserve officer who has spent the last three months in Sevastopol expresses the opinion that the primary object of the revolutionary plot among the battleship crews of the Black Sea fleet was armed robbery. The leaders of the conspiracy hoped to enlist the aid of at least a thousand mutinous seamen and petty officers, who, having got for cible possession of certain battleships, cruisers, and destroyers, were, in small squadrons, to proceed severally to Odessa, Theodosia, Novorossisk, New Athos, and Batum, and, under threats of bombarding those places, were to exact blackmail tribute to the amount of not less than \$5,000,000.

These armed raids successfully accomplished, the mutineers, emulating the example of the Kniaz Potemkin battleship which mutinied in 1905, were to steam either to the Roumanian or the Anatolian coast, or partly to both of those foreign littorals, and scuttle and abandon the ships. The mutineers were to be rewarded with \$2,500,000, the remaining ninety going to the executive committees of the revolutionary and anarchist propagandists.

LONDON, Oct. 16—(Special)—While the "decay of manners" is frequently deplored, the Lord Mayor of London, Londoners are steadily improving, and that the improvement is one of the features of the day.

For the second time within a month it happened that the Mansion House magistrate was presented with white gloves in celebration of the fact that neither charge nor summons was in the chair. Sir Thomas Crosby was in the chair, and he remarked on the improving state of affairs.

"I have been a magistrate of the city for sixteen years," said the Lord Mayor, "and it was a great satisfaction to me to be able to congratulate the City on the improvement indicated by the fact that I had no cases to try."

LONDON, Oct. 17—(Special)—London is preparing for its season, and is waking up from its summer vacation. The old custom of "the season" beginning when Parliament resumes its deliberations in the autumn no longer holds good, and already a large number of the leaders of society have come back to their town quarters. Most of the private schools are now open—a sure indication that the summer holidays are at an end—and throughout the West-end the dust sheets are being removed from clubs and private dwelling-houses.

Almost every club in Piccadilly has been in the hands of the decorators for the past few months, and in Pall-mall a regular army of workmen have been in possession of the premises. During the vacation when the clubs are being redecorated and freshened up it is usual for those members who have been turned out of their abode to take up quarters on the premises of a neighboring club, but in some cases this year this has not been found practicable, for some members refused to go out of town owing to the bad weather. The result is that not a few have had to spend their summer months in hotels, and have experienced the inconvenience attached to the bustle of holiday-makers and tourists. By the middle of this month, however, the British workman will have vanished from the West-end, taking with him his paints and varnishes and his hob-nailed boots, and peace will reign once again.

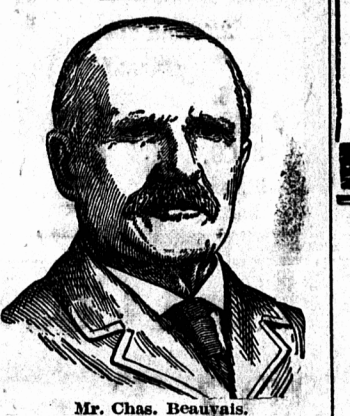
BERLIN, Oct. 17—(Special)—For the moment the Prussian Guard is in bad order. Only recently an entire company of one of the infantry battalions was found guilty of cheating at a shooting match, and yesterday several non-commissioned officers and men of the Gades du Corps, the crack cavalry regiment, whose nominal function it is to afford immediate protection to the person of the Sovereign, were sentenced by the court martial at Potsdam for ill-treatment of recruits. It appeared from the evidence that newcomers to the Guard were indiscriminately subjected to ill-usage by men who had already served a couple of years, but nothing was heard of this until one recruit, who, it is true, was said to have suffered from mental weakness at an earlier period of his life, became insane under the hands of his tormentors, and had to be removed to the hospital. The attendants then found that the whole of his body was covered with blue weals.

It was deposed by the father of this man that he received from the barracks a letter beginning with these words: "We recruits inform you that your son has been terribly beaten, and that we are now being treated in the same way. We are all beaten by the older men, but they have knocked the wits out of your son."

LONDON, Oct. 21, (Special)—Punishment by instalments is a remedy proposed for the action of Suffragettes in instituting hunger strikes, and so compelling the authorities to release them before their sentences have been served. A change of the law would be necessary, but the idea is that the authorities should be empowered to secure that a sentence might be served in instalments if the health of the prisoners prevented its being carried through in one, and if the indisposition was occasioned by the deliberate acts of the prisoner.

ST. PETERSBURG, Oct. 21—(Special)—The notorious brigand Kosovoy, who a few days ago was shot in the suburbs of Odessa, in an encounter with the police, had a funeral worthy of his career.

At the cemetery all the thieves and criminals of the adjacent towns—more than 200—asssembled, and when the coffin was lowered into the grave several of them fired off revolvers by way of a last salute to their departed comrade.

The police, however, lay in wait in great force outside the cemetery gates, and when the crowd of law-breaking mourners returned into the street, the officers drew a cordon around them.

The thieves then made a determined attack on them, and in the fighting thirty were injured and one killed. Seven policemen were put out of action.
