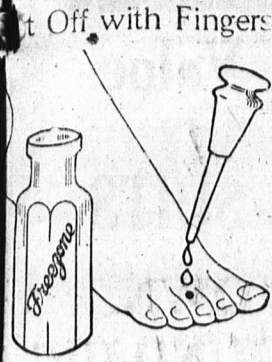

THEIR VOTES AS THEY WERE COMMANDED, BY THEIR COMMANDING OFFICERS WHOM HE WOULD HAVE THE PEOPLE BELIEVE WERE EQUALLY UNPRINCIPLED.

But Mr. Hughes awoke to the discovery that the living of those soldiers were now at home, and ready to trump his slanders upon them and their officers, and so with weakened hand and fainting heart he has diverted his attention to the new game known as "Farmers' Bluff" in short he thinks it popular, in these days of political stress to be a farmer and so he essays to pose in the garb of Cain, not only as the slayer of his country, but also as a tiller of the soil, and also like this ancient prototype in offering unacceptable sacrifices? In truth he does possess some acres, but NOT SO LARGE A FARM as that of his opponent Mr. McIsaac. His more notable accomplishment is in FARMING THE FARMERS for which purpose he has a chain of central depots throughout the County, gilded by such titles as J. J. Hughes, Ltd., and which his friends, and probably he himself is banking to produce a rich election crop. The days of ledger influence however have gone by, our farmers are too independent to be garnered in by political reapers of this kind, and they are finding that MERGER system which they are so fond of denouncing in other provinces is not proving so effective an implement when used and applied by themselves. And more's the pity.

This "Bluff" he prefers to the discussion of political records, for NEITHER HE NOR HIS PARTY HAVE ANY exception that which they ARE ASHAMED TO RECOGNIZE. MacKenzie King and his Lieutenants have publicly repudiated every fraction of party policy that they ever announced, and Mr. Hughes is without any personal record to be proud of. His opponent, Mr. McIsaac in the three short years of his incumbency has more of real benefit to his constituents to show to his credit. THAN MR. HUGHES CAN SHOW IN ALL THE SEVERAL LONG TERMS IN WHICH THE PEOPLE ENTRUSTED HIM WITH A SEAT IN THE HOUSE OF COMMONS. While Mr. Hughes was busy farming or rather developing a peculiar kind of grist from such institutions as "Fish Drier's" Mr. McIsaac took the opposite course in building harbors and landing places and providing accommodation and assistance for those who did the fishing. He was satisfied with his seasonal indemnity in full for his services and was not forever chasing the Government to add to it by patronage, very much unlike Mr. Hughes, who, like the description of the man in the parable was "Reaping where thou hast not sown, and gathering where thou hast not sowed."

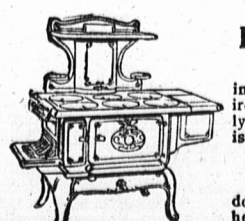

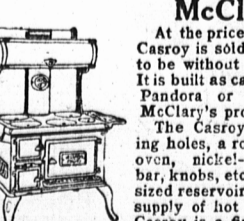

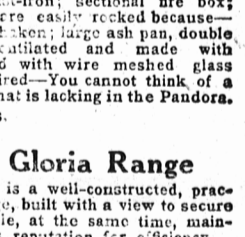
