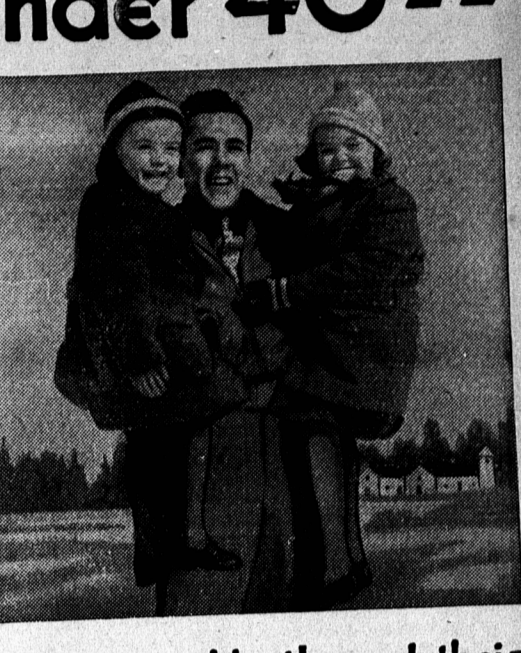
BULLISH TREND ON MT'L. MART
