CHEESE AND BUTTER PRODUCTION REPORTS

The following reports, one on cheese production, the other on butter, were presented at the annual meeting of the Dairywomen's Association yesterday by the Provincial Dairy Inspector H. J. McDonald.

BUTTER PRODUCTION

To the Directors and members of the Dairywomen's Association. Gentlemen: It is customary in this province at the annual meeting of this Association for someone to report the year's activities in the dairying industry, and this year I have the duty.

Yeast and Mould

In the analysis of yeasts and moulds the following are determined: Total yeasts and moulds per cubic centimeter. Excellent 11 to 50. Good 51 to 100. Fair 101 to 200. Poor 201 to 500.

Grading of Butter

The grading of butter continued throughout the summer and fall. The first grading was June 27th and the last on December 4th. It was done every two weeks during the warm weather and once a month in the laboratory work.

Cream Grading

Owing to the work in connection with educational butter cream and the amount of time taken in preparing the samples, the cream grading did not get as much attention as it should. However, all the available time was spent at the creamery.
