FIREMEN'S ANNUAL TOURNAMENT

Charlottetown Men to Participate in Halifax Sports.

Mr. Alfred Pickard, Secretary of the Charlottetown Fire Department, has received from the Firemen's Tournament Committee, Halifax, an invitation to participate in the tournament, which begins on August 3 and extends to August 8, these dates covering the annual summer carnival.

FIREMEN'S EVENTS

1.—QUARTER MILE HOSE REEL RACE. Reel to carry three hundred feet of regulation size fire hose, run to hydrant and connect, lay out 250 ft. of hose, break coupling and put on pipe, time to be taken when the pipe strikes the ground, for every quarter turn that can afterwards be given at pipe or hydrant, one half second will be added to the running time, race to be run dry single on time. First Prize \$250.00. Second Prize, \$150.00. Third \$50.00.

2.—FIFTY YARDS LADDER RACE

Teams of seven men run 50 yards with 28 ft. ladder, raise ladder and mount, time to be taken when the ladder runner grasps the top rung, runner to start on the ground, J. C. McLeod... 129,675

3.—SALVAGE CORPS RACE

Run one quarter of a mile with horse reel or hose carriage. First Prize, \$100.00. Second Prize, \$50.00.

4.—HOSE COUPLING MAKE UP

Distance 100 yards, two men to run 50 yards each, meet in the centre and make coupling, time to be taken when the coupling touches the ground, for every quarter turn that can be given the coupling, one half second will be added to the running time. First Prize, \$20.00.

5.—HOSE COUPLING BREAK AND MAKE

Distance the same as No. 4, two men run, meet in the centre and break coupling, put on branch pipe, time taken when the coupling touches the ground for every quarter turn that can be given the coupling, one half second will be added to running time. First Prize, \$20.00. Second Prize, \$10.00.

6.—VETERAN FIREMEN'S RACE

50 years or over, distance 100 yds. First Prize, \$15.00. Second Prize \$10.00.

7.—CONCILIATION RACE

Open to firemen who have not won anything in any other event, distance 220 yards. First Prize \$20.00. Second Prize \$15.00. Third Prize, \$10.00.

8.—FIREMEN'S PLAT RACE

Open to all fire departments, distance 100 yards. First Prize, 15.00. Second Prize, \$10.00. Third Prize \$5.00.
