entertaining hate for twenty-four hours is suggested.

It is "giving place to wrath," that we are warned against, that is, letting it in and being hospitable toward it, giving it board and lodging. It makes itself at home then, and there is a fatal pride of consistency that prevents the will from turning the teat out. If he ought ever to have come in, now he ought to stay, that is the reasoning. The doctrine of the text is, that all accounts of the day should be squared before sunset. That one may go to his bed as he hopes to go to his grave; at peace.

One who falls into anger and rescues himself, gets out of it before night—turns away from it, forsakes it, shows to himself and others that his fall was an accident, a mere rush of blood to the head. But one who willingly goes to sleep with the thing in his heart, shows to himself and others that it is a deliberate crime of the will. He has consented to it. He thinks like Jonah, that he does well to be angry.

"They say 'Revenge is sweet,'" the saying is not true. Revenge is not sweet, it is very bitter. "Avenge not yourselves," says God. "Vengeance is mine, and I will repay." There is no need for anyone to volunteer a private vengeance. That matter we may well believe is taken care of in every case. "The mills of God grind slowly," but they grind. There is no way out of it, except by repentance and doing works meet for repentance.

Of course there is no use in fighting anger upon its own level, by resolutions. Nothing is so fatal to it as a serious shot. Fifty years will see them all gone and while they live, we may be certain that they are not happy.

The things that separate between man and man are little things, allowed to grow. Certain Sicilians who form a colony in New Orleans, always fight and knife one another when they meet. When you inquire the reason for the vendetta, there is no reason. The foundation of the quarrel is forgotten. So senseless is much of the strife that makes the earth wet with tears and blood.

The direction of the text is to take care of the day. Not spoil it by things brought over from yesterday. To rise in the morning with a good heart and a restored soul. Life, as short as it is, is not altogether pleasant to make the best of it. It is a pilgrimage and the path if rough, and it seems the knapsack gets heavier as the strength gets less to bear it. It is not possible to look at this caravan with any doubt that each is getting now, or, will something reach all the grief he needs. Our own hope in the mercy of God—bids us—be merciful to our comrades. Let us make the march from the cradle to the grave as pleasant as possible. 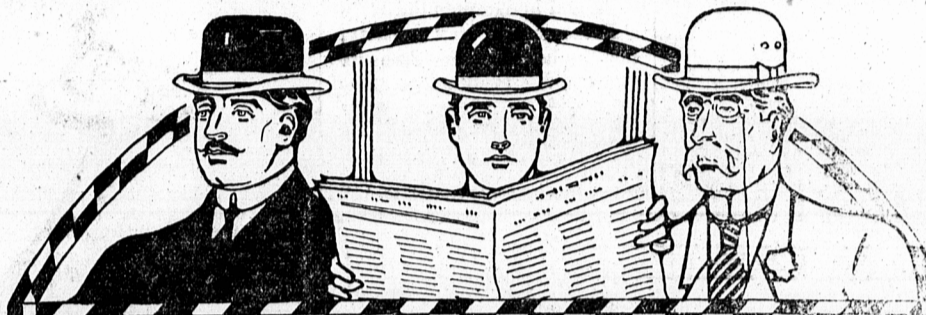

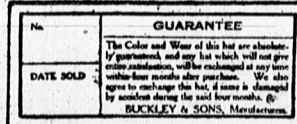

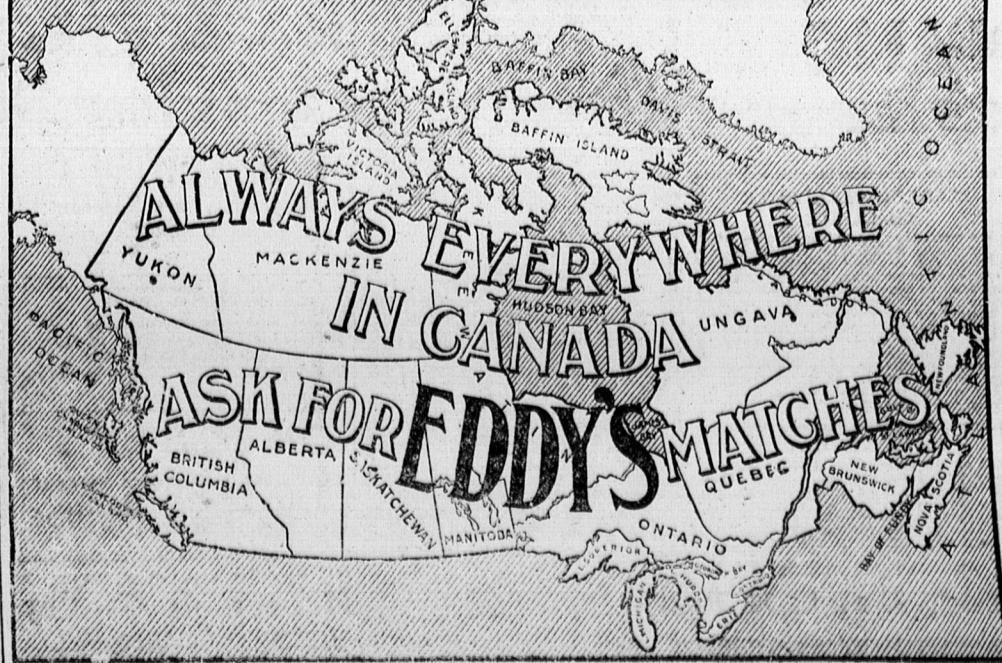
