

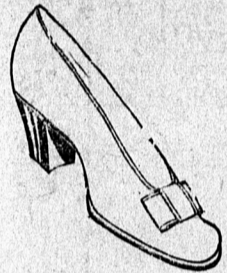

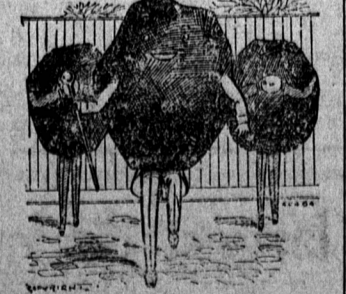

## OUR LONDON LETTER

mineralists. Mr. John Redmond has thrown down the gauntlet to the Prime Minister by his assertion that, in the event of no agreement being reached in regard to the concessions, he will consider himself free to act independently of the Government; that is, in plain language, having wrung from the present administration the Home Rule measure for which he has worked for thirty years the Nationalist leader, deaf to all danger cries from Ulster, will insist that his party shall enjoy the victory without consideration of the vanquished. But there will still be 100,000 Ulster volunteers aided by thousands elsewhere, who will be ready to see that Shylock does not get his pound of flesh.

To allude to the defeat of the measure for Sunday closing in English to speak almost in an unknown language to residents of a province which knows no opening of bars and saloons. It is only those who have lived in the older countries who can appreciate the hide-bound customs and traditions under which the "public-house, originally a legitimate provision for travellers, has in the process of civilization developed into a drinking den, so that today the "licensed victualler" makes all his profit on drink rather than upon food. Although these establishments are now closed on Sunday in Scotland and Wales and in most overseas dominions, England has always resisted the attempts of church and temperance folk, for the liquor traffic is rich, and its opponents are admittedly mainly of the middle and working classes. The second reading of a private bill had been anticipated by the "trade," with the result that it was one of the few measures enjoying Government facilities, which suffered defeat this session.

Whether the Roman Catholic Church has the power to annul a marriage on the ground of a degree of consanguinity not banned by the civil courts, is the problem that has been brought before the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council in London this week. Arguments have been heard in the case of Despatie v. Tremblay, a French Canadian couple who after marriage discovered a consanguinity in the fourth degree existed between them. The marriage was annulled by the Bishop at the instance of the husband, and the Canadian Courts have upheld the canonical decree. In reserving judgment, the Lord Chancellor asked counsel to furnish them with a list of authorities, remarking that the appeal was a very difficult one.

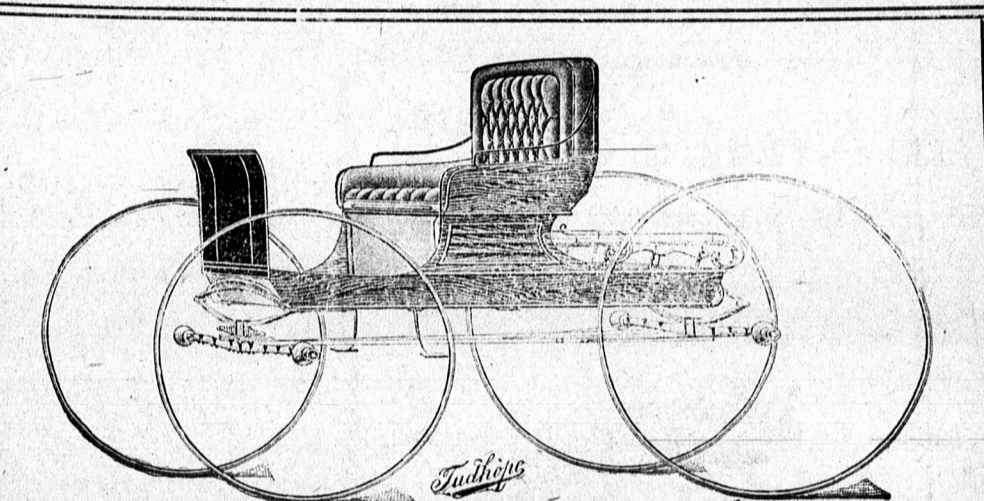
