GOOD IN EVIL.

"There is some soul of goodness in things evil. Thus our bad neighbors make us early stirrers, which is both useful and good husbandry." So Shakespeare set it down and so it is. Take the storm that wrecked so many vessels and cost so many precious lives on our shores a few weeks ago. It called forth the heroism of Grady, Campbell, Champion and others and set their gallant deeds conspicuously in the public eye. Are we not the richer for these acts of self-sacrificing and exalted courage? And a dilatory Government has been moved to promise life-saving stations for the future.

So may we hope our winter disabilities, so forcibly set forth by Mr. Full in his letter in The Guardian of Friday last, will yet work out the one sovereign remedy of railway connection with the Mainland. How apparent it is that no remedy short of the Tunnel will give Prince Edward Island her emancipation. Without it we cannot have manufacturing industries. Without it we must go on losing one third of the value of our exportable products, suffering the cost of the multiplied transshipments and paying three local rates of freight instead of one through rate. The very extremity of our disabilities is fast becoming the most powerful argument for redress.

The terrible experience of the winter of 1905 will never be forgotten. We rejoiced in the more favorable conditions of last winter, and yet the temporary boon will be dearly paid for if it should delay, as there is reason to fear it has delayed, the one only adequate remedy for our wrongs. Three winters in succession like that of 1905 would have forced the construction of the Tunnel, or driven our Province into secession, and either result would be worth even such enormous cost.

As it is, no Province in the Dominion pays so dearly for her share in the compact. No Province is so shut out from the advantages which come to the other Provinces from the union. With no other Province has the Dominion so broken faith. In no other Province have the services with which the federal Government is charged been so much mismanaged. But all these things, so seemingly evil and intolerable, may be working out to noble and useful ends. It may be best for us in the long run that these things have been and are as they are. We will not despair. When things come to their worst they are often about to mend. So far the stronger Provinces have been eating up our substance. It may yet be as in the days of Sampson, that "out of the eater all come forth meat."
We must have the Tunnel!

THE CHURCHES MOVING.

That was an inspiring letter of Rev. J. E. Tiner of the Tryon Baptist church which we published on Saturday. And it was a noble resolve of the church and its pastor to throw their weight into the scale for pure elections. We trust the example may be faithful of like resolves in many other churches in the land. Great is the power of the churches in any and every community—greater than they realize. And if one by one every church in Canada would do its best by example and education to influence to promote clean elections and frown down the debasing practices that have crept in, electoral corruption would be swept from the land.

That the good work is moving in the hearts and minds of other pastors and other churches we have abundant evidence. An instance of this was seen when a few nights ago we had Presbyterian, Catholic, Methodist and Baptist pastors speaking from one common platform in support of the movement to purge our representative system of its corrupt and corrupting elements. It is not for personal gain or personal glory that these pastors and other citizens here and throughout the Province are putting their hands to this great work. They see the danger and the evil and they seek to save the community and the state.

What is corruption? It is decay, decomposition in a corporal frame from which the life has gone out. The human body in life is admirable and noble. But when a limb mortifies it must be amputated and when life has left the body it speedily decays and becomes a loathsome thing. Thus it is with the body politic. When patriotism and the spirit of honest citizenship die within it, the body is dead and speedily putrefies. With an electorate entirely venal our free institutions would be dashed below the meanest despotism. We have not yet reached this last stage of corruption. Much of the electorate is still sound at heart, but there are already limbs and members that are gangrened, and these must be cut away if the body is to be saved.

To purge our electoral system of its corrupt and corrupting elements is the most important and urgent duty of the hour. It cannot wait. What are our great railway and industrial enterprises, our tariffs and our party struggles in comparison with this battle for the very life of the country? All honor to the

Synopsis of Canadian Northwest HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS.

ANY even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, excepting 8 and 9, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, in the event of one-quarter section of 160 acres more or less.

Entry must be made personally at the local land office for the district in which the land is situated.

Entries must be made personally at the local land office for the district in which the land is situated.

One homesteader is required to perform the conditions connected therewith under one of the following plans:

(1) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year for three years.

(2) If the father or mother, if the father is deceased, of the homesteader resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for the requirements as to residence may be satisfied by such person residing with the father or mother.

(3) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of the homestead, the requirements as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the said land.

Six months' notice in writing should be given to the Commissioner of Dominion Lands, Ottawa, of intention to apply for entry.
